reports. had been compiled from information supplied by the Head Master of the Junior Technical School (Mr. H. B. Garner) and which was supplementary to the report on expected commitments prepared by Mr. Hyall in 1950. The President said that the information was so important that it had been forwarded to the Department without delay. Mr. Hyall said that from information he had received ~~the previous~~ <sup>that</sup> day the proposed new Junior Technical School in Ballgarath North would probably be in operation before the extensions to the present school were carried out. He also said that in his opinion the present Junior Technical School was taking boys who could not complete the course laid down and for which there was a provision at Humphrey Street school. It was resolved that a deputation consisting of the President and the Principal, with power to add, wait on the Chief Inspector and urge the need for an early commencement with the approved extensions. 16-5-51 Edward Request.  
Mr. Sutton and the Principal reported that they had consulted Counsel (Ch. Lush) on Friday 11. May regarding an application to the Court for a variation in the terms of this request on the grounds that ~~it~~ <sup>they</sup> could not now be carried out. Counsel's opinion was that only two parties would be involved - the School and the Attorney General - and that the judge would award costs out of the capital fund. Counsel also said that the Court would approve of a variation closely related to the terms of the request but first of all it would be necessary to prove that the Minister of Education would not agree to the augmentation of the salary of an Instructor in Mineralogy by the income received from the request investments. Counsel also requested certain information in regard to the Constitution of the School, Certificate of Incorporation and copies of any regulations regarding payment of salaries, rates, bonuses etc.

Both Mr. Sutton and the Principal felt that it was desirable to supply the information requested and to proceed with the matter. It was resolved that the matter be left in the hands of Mr. Sutton and the Principal. (Per Killson & Mail)
