On entering the Plumbing Department they  
were confronted with the unsightly  
wash basins, about which so much  
had been heard during recent years.  
These basins are certainly a very  
poor advertisement for a Plumbing  
Department.

Mr C. L. Lulloch, Instructor on duty,  
suggested that the work benches be  
topped with asbestos and they  
agreed that such attention was
