The principal detailed a number of incidents ~~at that~~ <sup>which</sup> had led up to the posting of the notice and said that firm action was called for as members of the staff and students were most incensed.

The following students were then interrogated individually:

Robert G. Archer 4<sup>th</sup> Year, Elaine W. Hayes 4<sup>th</sup> Year, James C. Sawyer 4<sup>th</sup> Year, John A. Watts 3<sup>rd</sup> Year and John L. Collier 2<sup>nd</sup> Year.

With the exception of John A. Watts they all admitted being implicated in various incidents and John Collier admitted writing the notice and submitting a draft to the others.

The committee then discussed the matter and decided on the following penalties. —

Messrs Archer, Hayes and Sawyer each to be fined \$1, to be severely reprimanded and be called on to give an assurance that there would be no repetition of their unseemly conduct.

J. L. Collier to be suspended from classes for the balance of this term, to display <sup>on the inside</sup> board a written apology and withdrawal over his signature, ~~and~~ subject to the approval of the Principal, and to give an undertaking that there would be no repetition of his offence.

It was also decided that the parents of the students concerned be notified of the action taken and asked to call on the Principal who was desirous of discussing the matter with them.

The students were then recalled in a group and told the findings of the Committee. All gave an assurance that there would not be a repetition of their unseemly conduct.

This concluded the business and the meeting closed.
