Site for new Junior Technical School in Ballarat North.

The Registrar reported that late in the afternoon he had received a

18-8-54 Telephone call from the Education Department in connection with the area in Norman Street about to be acquired as the site for the proposed new Junior Technical School.

The Education Department was desirous of commencing building operations as soon as possible. The Public Works Department had chosen the eastern end of the block for the school buildings and on that area was a cottage and some out-buildings which were occupied on a weekly rental basis by a man and his family. The Education Department requested the School Council to obtain full particulars of the occupant and to explore the possibilities of arranging with the tenant to vacate the premises.

Mr Pearson suggested that the removal of the buildings to another part of the block where they would not be in the way might be a satisfactory solution, and a residence for a caretaker would probably be required when the school is erected.

It was resolved that the matter be left in the hands of the President and the Principal to discuss the matter with the occupant and advise the Education Department accordingly.
