Gymnasium and Recreation Hall.

The Principal gave an outline of the scheme for the erection of this building and said that the total cost, excluding sewerage connections, was now estimated to be £8089. Of this amount the Education Department had promised to

21-3-56 provide £3250. The Hall Committee was confident that the balance would be forthcoming from monies in hand and from various efforts under way.

As the Department's subsidy would be available after the end of June it was considered to be essential that we should be in a position by that date to lodge a claim supported by accounts for at least £3250 of work done.

Mr. A. Chason was prepared to carry out the work and to stop when our funds are exhausted. He had already co-operated in a most helpful manner and in the opinion of the Committee the job could safely be left in his hands.

In reply to a question regarding the calling of tenders the Principal said that there was no one on the staff who was capable of preparing the detailed specifications that would be necessary, and in addition there was the certainty that a halt would have to be called to the job, before completion until further funds were available.

Mr. Webb said that he had examined the plans and the estimate submitted by Mr. Chason and felt that it was satisfactory.

It was resolved that the scheme outlined by the Principal be approved, and that the erection of the building be proceeded with.
