Council Meeting

Held in the Council Room on Wednesday,
18th July 1956 at 8 p.m.

Present The President, C^t E. Lippett (Chair)
Vice-Presidents Mrs G. P. John and

Apology An apology was received from C^t H. L.
Allnutt.

Welcome to C^t H. A. Patterson.

Before commencing business the President
extended a warm welcome to C^t H. A.
Patterson, newly appointed member
of the Council, and said that C^t H.
Patterson's appointment was the
result of the Council's desire to have
a close link with farming interests.
C^t Patterson suitably responded.

Minutes The minutes of the last meeting, held
on 20th June, were taken as read
and were confirmed.

Business arising out of Minutes Acquisition of property at 123 Grand Street.
The President reported that the committee
appointed at the last meeting had met
and discussed this matter. C^t Webb
had supplied figures relating to the
removal and re-siting of a house similar

in size to the one occupied by Mr Headlam.
These figures showed that after purchasing
a block, shifting and re-siting the house,
re-plastering, re-wiring, re-painting and
reinstalling plumbing and sewerage,
it would appear that a sum of
approximately £400 would be in hand
out of the £2800 offered by the Education
Department. This information had
been conveyed to C^t and Mrs Headlam
by the Registrar, but so far they had not
made up their minds.

C^t Webb reported that he had called
on C^t and Mrs Headlam and found
that they were still undecided
whether to shift the house or to
purchase a home already built.

He tried to convince them that the
first proposition was the better one
and would probably result in their
having a few hundred pounds in hand
after the shift and re-siting was
completed, whereas the purchase of
a home already built would involve
them in an outlay considerable in
excess of the amount the Education
Department is prepared to pay.

The President said that the next step
by the committee would be to meet
C^t and Mrs Headlam and endeavour
to arrive at some finality.
