

Ballarat College War Memorial

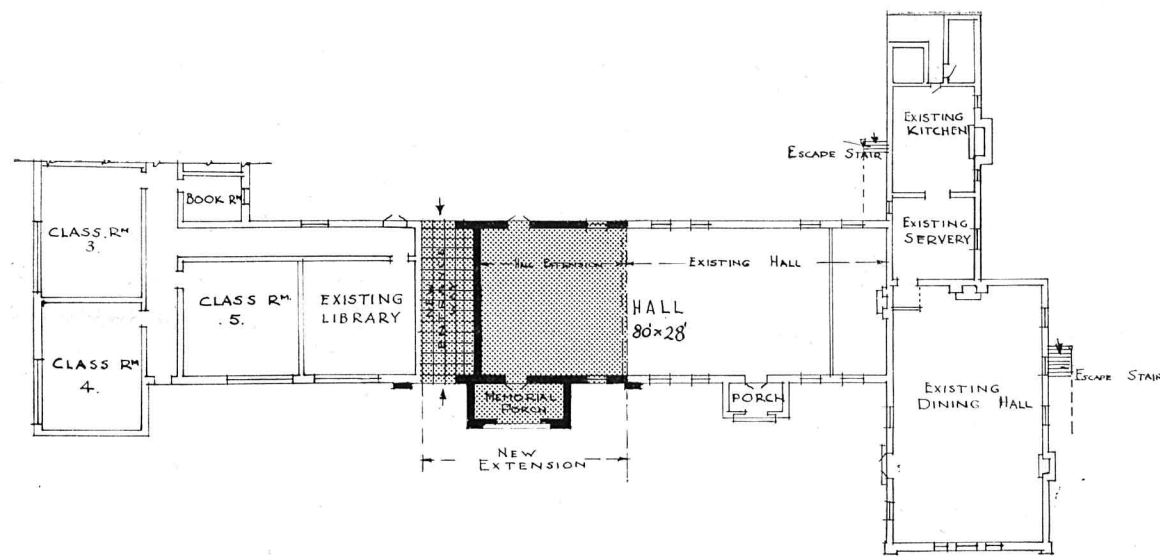

The highest tribute which we may pay to the fallen is to preserve for future generations the ideals which gave them courage, and the institutions which nurtured them.

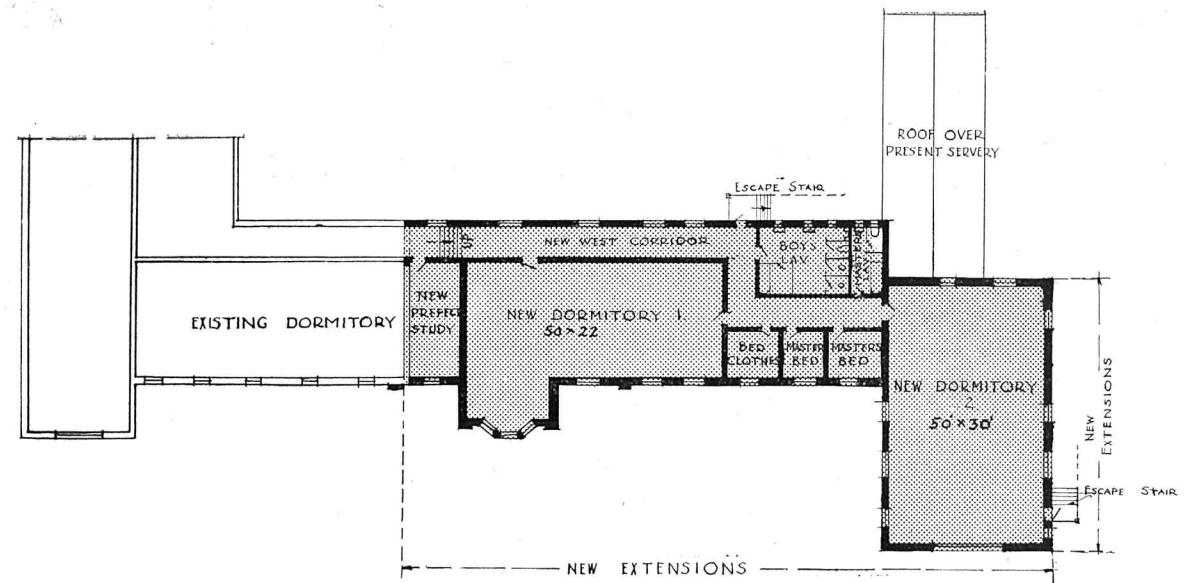

The illustration shows the design of the completed buildings, which has been prepared for the Committee by the architect, Mr. H. L. Coburn.

The central portion of the Memorial includes the clock-tower and an extension of the present Memorial Hall, with appropriate furnishings and Roll of Honour.

The remaining portion, consisting of a second-story extension over the existing Memorial and MacFarland Halls, thereby completing the front facade of the building, will provide rooms and facilities essential in the daily life of the school.

Placed as it will be in the fine setting fronting Sturt Street, in view of all who come and go about the school, the Memorial will stand as a pre-eminent witness to the service and sacrifice of those Old Boys who died for their country.

The sum of at least £9,000 will be required to carry out the scheme. The Committee therefore appeals to the generosity of Old Collegians, parents and friends of the school to make this War Memorial Appeal a success.

TAXATION CONCESSION.
