

With its elegant bush setting and position in a deep lush valley, Steavenson Falls is one of the District's most significant tourist attractions. Discovered in the 1860s, Steavenson Falls quickly became a popular tourism attraction. The Falls and river are named after Surveyor John Steavenson, who worked in the area in 1862 on a road project from Melbourne to Woods Point.

You can drive, ride or walk to the Falls, which has a main drop of 85 metres. They can be viewed from both sides of the Steavenson River as well as from the steel footbridge that crosses the river just downstream from the waterfall.

A viewing platform located at the top of the Falls offers an excellent view of the valley and river below. The walk to the top takes around 15 minutes and the track is moderate grade.



Further downstream on the edge of the river is a small hydro electric generator that supplies the flood lighting for the falls at night. A track connects the Falls viewing area with the generator.

The carpark area is sealed and includes the Little Steavenson Falls on the western side of the carpark. It also includes a modern toilet block, a large viewing platform which overhangs the Steavenson Valley and interpretive signage.

Waterfalls are dangerous and viewers should stay within the constructed perimeters. During wet times the walking track and stairs can be slippery and caution should always be taken.

Please note that parking fees apply if you are parking in the carpark.

Please ensure you have the correct footwear and clothing, as conditions can change quickly in the Victorian bush. Always be aware of snakes.


