

Phantom Falls is a cascade style waterfall with only a small section of the larger 35 metre drop visible. It is located in the Keppel Falls Scenic Reserve. The 400 m pathway to the waterfall meanders through beautiful lush Victorian bush and over two bridges. The waterfall has a viewing platform and seat which allows the visitor to take a break while appreciating the Falls. The platform can be slippery when wet, so care should always be taken.

While the waterfall is lovely at any time of year, the most rewarding time to visit is after a heavy rain. Spring is also a good time to visit the Falls as the melting snow can contribute significantly to the flow.



The walk to the waterfall takes you over the highly regarded Taggerty River and is highly photographic from the bridge.

Please be aware that all waterfalls are extremely dangerous and viewers should stay within the constructed perimeters at all times. In the warmer months we recommend you take a drink and some snacks.

Caution should always be taken in the bush. Ensure you have correct footwear and clothing as conditions can change unexpectedly. Always let someone know your travel plans. In the wetter months this area is prone to leeches so avoid contact with vegetation and always ensure you have quality footwear and long pants.


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MARYSVILLE

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Travel to Marysville.
- From Marysville, travel to the lower roundabout and travel south up the Marysville-Woods Point Road past the Crossways Inn.
- 3. Travel 300 m and turn left at the intersection down Lady Talbot Drive.
- 4. Travel 8.4 km to the carpark of the Phantom Falls on your left.
- Walk just over 800 m to Phantom Falls. The pathway will take you over two lovely bridges.

The walking grade is medium thanks to the established pathway and bridges that have been built, though there are some steep areas along the pathway. Care should always be taken during wet times as the track can get slippery in places.

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
