

Discovered by John Keppel just prior to 1910, it is one of the larger and more spectacular Falls in the District. However, it is better described as a long section of cascading water running over large granite boulders, than an actual waterfall. The Falls are magnificent after heavy soaking rain, but are still excellent in the drier summer months.

The walking track is of medium grade and follows the river upstream to the Falls viewing platform. The track takes the walker through beautiful pristine Australian bush, which is full of lush flora and fauna. The path winds through the bush for around 1 km before delivering you to an elevated viewing platform which extends partially over the lower section of the Falls.



The platform affords the viewer an excellent unrestricted view of the upper Falls and photographers will appreciate the opportunity to capture scenes of the cascading water.

When Keppel Falls was first discovered, Lady Talbot Drive was soon extended to allow for tourists to visit the new natural feature. Other tourist attractions that share the Keppel name are Keppel Hut and Keppel Lookout.

The former historic Keppel Hotel which once stood on the site of the current Vibe Resort in the heart of Marysville, was renamed to the Cumberland Resort before it was destroyed during the 2009 Black Saturday Bushfires.

Caution should always be taken in the Bush. Ensure you have correct footwear and clothing as conditions can change unexpectedly. It is worth taking water and small snacks on this trip and always let someone know of your travel plans. Children should be supervised at all times.

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Travel to Marysville.
- 2. From Marysville, travel to the lower roundabout and travel south up Woods Point Road, past the Crossways Inn.
- 3. Travel 300 m and turn left into Lady Talbot Drive.
- 4. Travel 10.5 km to the carpark of the Keppel Falls Waterfall on your left.
- 5. Walk 1 km to the Falls viewing area.

The walking grade is medium thanks to the established pathway and bridges that have been built. Care should always be taken during wet times as tracks can be slippery.
