The Meeting of the Waters is an amazing little area where the Taggerty River and White House Creek combine to make the beautiful Taggerty River.

The walk from the carpark area to the Meeting of the Waters takes around 20 minutes and the walking track is of moderate grade.

The pathway crosses the Taggerty River twice on the way to the Meeting of the Waters and these little bridges are amazing in themselves as they offer a fantastic view amongst the classic Australian Bush setting.

The walk is even more amazing during the Autumn time when it is colourful and exciting, though each season offers its very own special surprises, making this walk a must do for tourists and locals.

The Meeting of the Waters is such a tranquil and pretty place with an almost surreal feel to it due to the lovely trees and the exposed root systems on some of them.

The pathway can be dangerous in places and you should always stay within the marked area and keep a close eye on children. In the wetter periods walk carefully as the pathway can become very slippery.

Ensure you have correct footwear and clothing as conditions can change unexpectedly.

Always let someone know your travel plans.

In the wetter months this area is prone to leaches so avoid contact with vegetation and always ensure you have full cover footwear with good tread as well as socks and long pants.

Children should be supervised at all times.



## **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Travel to Marysville.
- 2. From Marysville, travel to the lower roundabout and travel south up "Wood Point Road" past the Crossways Inn.
- 3. Travel 300 metres and turn left at the intersection down Lady Talbot Drive.
- 4. Travel 12.9 kilometres to the carpark of the the Meeting of the Waters on your left and park your car (just over the bridge).
- 5. Walk the 800 metres to the Meeting of the Waters area.

The walking grade is medium thanks to the established pathway and bridges that have been built, though care should always be taken during wet times as the track can get slippery in places. It is a good idea to take fresh water with you in the hotter months.
