

Cora Lynn Falls is a medium sized cascading style waterfall, located along the Cumberland walk track in the Yarra Ranges National Park. The circuit track to the falls starts opposite the Cambarville Day Visitor Area on the Marysville-Woods Point Road.

While Cora Lynn is smaller than both the highly regarded Steavenson Falls and the picturesque Keppel Falls, it remains a popular falls due to its location and how close you can get to it. A carpark is located at the Cambarville Day Visitor Area. The Falls are 860 metres above sea level.



The waterfall is a ten minute walk from the Cambarville Day Visitor Area on a medium grade track. Cambarville has a large carpark, toilets and picnic tables (including one undercover picnic table). It is also the starting point for the walk to The Big Tree tourism attraction.

Cora Lynn Falls is one of a series of waterfalls found in the Marysville area. Others include the Steavenson Falls, Keppel Falls, Phantom Falls and the smaller Cumberland Falls - found on the same walk track as Cora Lynn Falls but with a poor view.

Temperature and conditions can change quickly in the alpine areas, so dress appropriately. It is best to carry water with you when walking in the bush and always let someone know of your travel plans. Please obey fire regulations during the fire season.

## DIRECTIONS

- From Marysville, travel along the Marysville-Woods Point Road for 17 kilometres (around 26 Minutes) or until you reach the Cora Lynn Falls carpark on your left.
- 2. Park in the carpark area and carefully cross the road and walk the 500 metres to the falls by following the marked track.
- 3. You can also access the Cumberland Falls along this track by following the signs.
- 4. Take care in wetter conditions as the track can be slippery and muddy.
