



The Cumberland Falls is a small forest Waterfall located between the *Sovereign View* and *Cora Lynn Falls* on the Cumberland Walking Track. The viewing platform for the Falls affords the viewer with a view of the Falls in the distance, however a clear view of the Falls is obscured by trees and ferns.

The track takes you past the *Sovereign View* where you get a view of the Armstrong Valley, though again trees partially block the view. Near the Falls is a picturesque bridge over the Cumberland Creek.



The Cumberland Waterfall is also near the Cora Lynn Falls which is also a must see for those who appreciate Waterfalls.

The Cumberland walking track also hosts *The Big Tree* and the *Cambarville Historic Township and Day* Cambarville Visitor Area which includes a carpark, toilets, picnic tables and one undercover picnic table.

Caution should always be taken in the Victorian Bush. Ensure you have correct footwear and clothing as conditions can change unexpectedly.

Some of the track includes stairs and steep gradients. Please pace yourself on the uphill sections of the track.

Children should be supervised at all times.

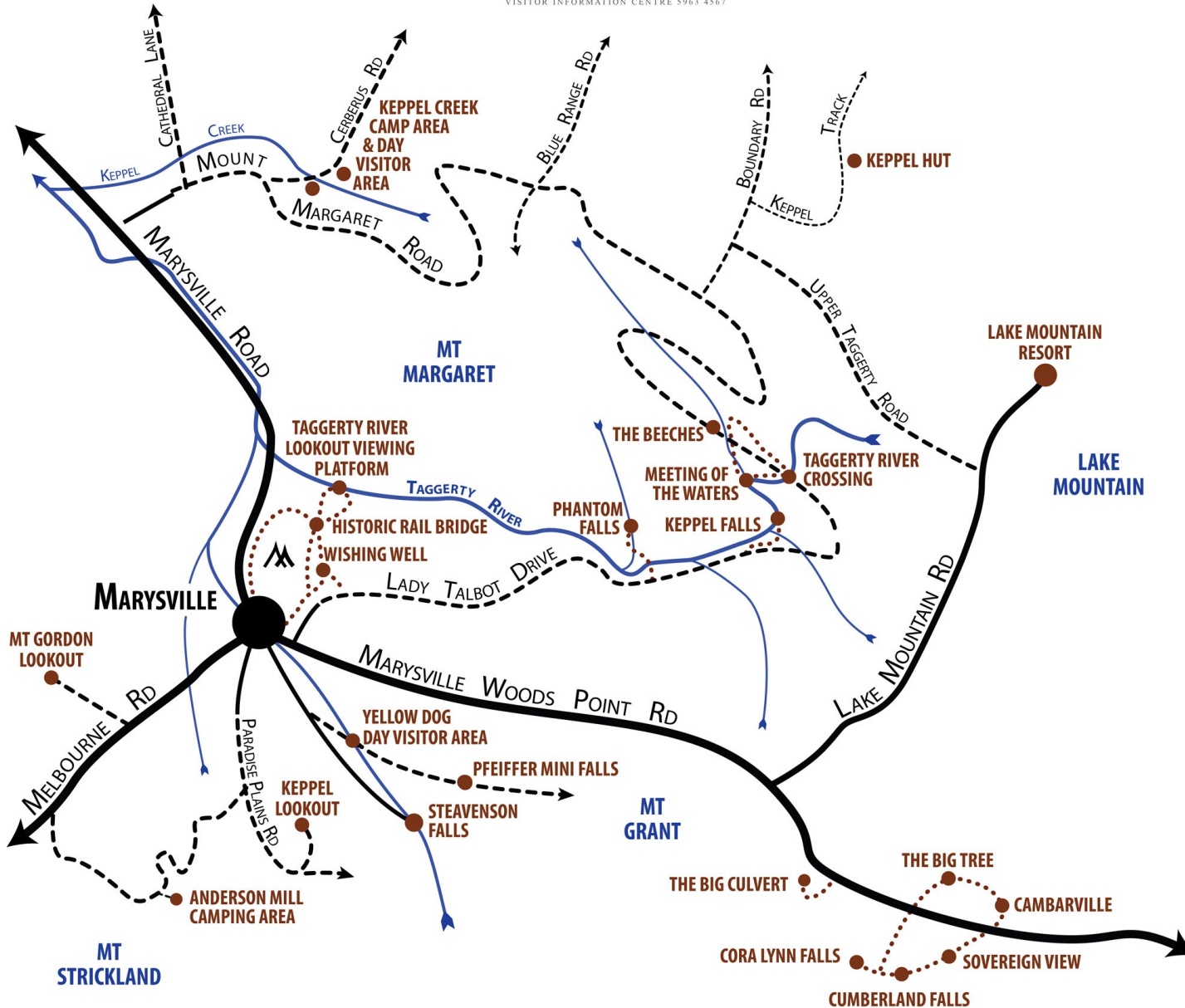

DIRECTIONS

1. From Marysville, travel along the Marysville-Woods Point Road for 18 kilometres (around 28 minutes) until you reach the Camberville Visitor Area turnoff. This is where you start your walk.
2. Park along the roadside or at the Camberville Visitor area and then follow the signed walking track for 15 minutes past the Sovereign View and the lovely small Cumberland Creek bridge to the Cumberland Falls viewing platform high above the falls.
3. The Sovereign View is a small area along the track where you can look down the Armstrong Valley.

*Take care in wetter conditions as the track can be slippery and muddy. The track does have some steps to help with the walking.
The walk is of medium grade.*
