**T**HIS Company is being formed for the purpose of acquiring from the Vendors (Messrs. Chester and Locke) their valuable Lease of 29 acres 2 roods 18 perches, situated at Yarra Track, between Marysville and Wood's Point, and known as the Golden Secret, and which has yielded such extremely handsome returns to the proprietors during the past few months.

There is abundance of water for the battery, and all rights have been secured. Firewood and timber are plentiful on the spot, thus saving the heavy expense in carting, &c.

A few remarks in reference to the discovery of the Golden Secret Reef by the Vendors will be no doubt interesting to the public.

The reef was first discovered by Messrs. Chester and Locke through the finding on the surface of small pieces of quartz, which on close examination were found to carry rich gold. A small prospecting shaft was then sunk on a vein only 8 inches thick, and followed down to 36 feet, and a crushing of six tons was sent to Bendigo for treatment, which yielded the very handsome return of 124 ozs. retorted gold. This shaft was continued to a further depth of 108 feet, the stone still being rich and widening to 10 inches, and another crushing was taken out, which yielded nearly 8 ozs. to the ton; and subsequently another crushing (80 tons), on 11th July, 1899, averaged the same result. This last lot was taken from the deepest part, and below water level, where the reef is now 2 feet wide, of a bluish colour, carrying coarse gold, and heavily mineralised. At this depth the water became a little troublesome, and not having a straight shaft to work with, they had to stop further operations pending the flotation into a company, as a new main shaft would be necessary, and the Vendors found it would be too costly for them to attempt by themselves; they have therefore decided to place it before the public on such reasonable terms that the flotation is practically assured.

As to its prospects the mine speaks for itself, and there is not the slightest hesitation in saying that it is without doubt a thoroughly safe investment, and that after cutting the reef in the drive from the new shaft, the Golden Secret will soon be amongst the dividend-paying mines of Victoria.

Golden Cake—Three Months' Work.—A fine cake of gold, the shape of a small basin turned upside down, weighing 122 ozs., the result of a crushing of six tons of stone from a reef found recently at Xarra Track, Lock. To a *London* reporter, who was present when they called, Messrs. Chester and Locke explained that they were induced to work a claim in the locality on account of the promising surface specimens they picked up when prospecting. They had been working for three months for the cake just obtained. They had sunk to a depth of 36 feet, and the reef was from 8 inches to 9 inches thick, and looked very promising. They had applied for a lease, which will shortly be issued.

Mr. Foster expressed himself gratified at the find, more particularly as it was one of the results of cutting trucks to the locality. He intended to have further track-cutting done in the district. He wished the prospectors every success, and promised to facilitate matters in connection with the issue of the lease, applied for some time since. The locality of the find is situated about 70 miles from Melbourne, and about 15 miles east of Marysville. There are several parties at work. The district was reported upon some time ago as a fairly likely one.

Over 2½ ozs. to the "Fox"—Messrs. Chester and Locke, who have been working at the Black Spur on the Yarra Track, on the road to Wood's Point, near Marysville, sent a trial lot of five tons to be crushed at Clark's Bechive Works, Eaglehawk. It gave the splendid return of 219 ozs. of amalgam, and retorted 122 ozs. of gold, or over 2½ ozs. per ton. The party have been prospecting in the locality for the past few months, and the stone, which is of a brownish appearance, is 6 inches wide. It came from a depth of about 50 feet. They will soon be able to get out another crushing. The country is pegged out all round them for miles.

Yarra Track.—Messrs. Chester and Locke have fitted up a battery for their claim, which recently returned some rich yields, and have started crushing. The plant consists of a 5-head battery and portable engine. On the Yarra Track Syndicate have opened up a nice looking reef, 3 feet wide, carrying good gold, and a crushing will be taken out. On Reilly and Barton's lease there is a large body of quartz exposed, said to prospect well.

CHESTERVILLE.—Messrs. Chester and Locke made a start crushing on Thursday. They have a 5-head battery, and there are about 70 tons of stuff at grass. The last crushing from this claim gave 124 ozs. of gold from six tons. The claim known as the Yarra Track Syndicate Lease is looking well. They have a nice reef, fully 3 feet thick, showing gold freely; they will get a trial crushing out shortly. On Sheehan and Kirwan's lease a tunnel has been started to cut Chester and Locke's reef. On O'Reilly and Barton's lease they have come on a fine body of stone, carrying a little gold.
