

Tree Fern Gully Nature Trail Walk loop is a favourite walk for locals and tourists who enjoy a medium length walk through pristine Australian Bush with a moderate elevation gain of 390 metres.

After the 2009 Black Saturday Bushfires devastated the area, the Department of Environment & Primary Industries (DEPI) worked to restore this track, turning it into arguably the best nature walk in the District.

The 3.4 km walk starts at Marysville's Gallipoli Park, and at a casual pace takes around one hour each way. The loop track features a well formed easy grade pathway, two bridges, exquisite fernery and native bushland, and the magnificent Steavenson Falls with all of its features.
