

The Anderson Mill Camp Area is located amongst thick bush, and offers the camper a very peaceful and relaxing camping experience. Its proximity to the small Wilks Creek (which can be heard from the camp site in the wetter months) makes it even more amazing.

The toilet facilities are modern, and picnic tables and fire pits make for a quality experience. A large horseyard (rebuilt by enthusiasts in partnership with the DEPI after the Black Saturday bushfires).

The camp area is located just 13 minutes drive from Marysville on a well made gravel road.

The camp area was established on what was once a timber mill site. The mill operated from 1930 until it closed in 1942. During that time the mill processed tall timbers from Mount Kitchener, transported to the mill via timber tramways. The Anderson No. 2 Mill was established 1 km from the Anderson No. 1 Mill in 1934 and operated until its closure in the late 1960s. The No. 2 mill processed timber from the Mount Strickland and the Acheron Valley areas, again using a timber tramway network for transport.



FROM MARYSVILLE

- 1. From the Marysville Information Centre, travel west along Murchison Street and turn left at the Lyell Street roundabout.
- 2. Continue along Lyell Street (Paradise Plains Road) for 1.9km, and turn right at Anderson Mill Track.
- 3. Travel for 1.6km and continue straight past Ron's Track to the left.
- 4. Travel for a further 0.2km and continue to straight past Wilks Creek Track on the left.
- 5. Travel for 0.7km and turn left into the Anderson Mill Camping Area. The camp area is a further 200 metres up this track.

Please note that roads in the park can be narrow.
Always be aware of native animals on the roads.
Fire regulations apply during the summer months.
Ensure you are aware of the daily restriction
status, before lighting any fires.
