It was a great shock to hear that Ken McKenzie had died at about 3 p.m. on Wednesday last. Ken was a great identity in the District and during his 73 years he helped many people in many different ways.

The following tribute to Ken was written by Sam Ross:-

"My reaction to the news of Ken's death was the same as any one elses who regarded him as a very special part of our local scene.

For instance he was very much in the public eye as our local and most obliging Taxi driver come ambulance etc., for the last 28 years that I know of and also as a peerless employee, manager and district representative of his brothers service and tour Bus Line.

Ken's early career was a a partner with his brother in a Blacksmith's business. Later, when the Bus company was formed, ken worked for many years for the Eltham Shire on road construction. After serving in the second war Ken was reunited with his family in Marysville and for sometime concentrated his own truck on pulpwood to Healesville Rail head.

Perhaps my first indelible impressions of Ken were during war time when he had join ed up for Army service and his impeccable wife Grace and later her sister (now Mrs Rita Ashton) took over the local bus agency. Grace also became temporary keeper of the family. "A" model Ford - which I must admit we used (at the tender age of 17 years) to see who was first to check oil, water and petrol (if any) and have a drive. Later when licensed we enjoyed many trips to Panton Hill where Ken's Ma and Pa in law had a small but productive farm.

As it happened, Ron, Kens eldest son could play us both on a break not only atchecking everything but actually driving - and all at the tender age of 8 years.

I know I am deviating from the true purpose of this note but I feel I must make one important tribute to Ken for allowing me the privilege of access to many vehicles under his care and so allowing me to learn to drive correctly. *SERVICH*

Kens health was affected when on final leave before embarkation for the Middle East. He fell down the ships staircase below decks in full. marching order (only!) and suffered a life long back injury which he didn't bother reporting to the company M.O. Notwith standing this injury Ken was a hard man to keep up with as a work mate - even doing concreting which he delighted ln.

The thing I remember most about Ken was the way he tackled any job without complaining in anyway.

When one thinks of the hours required to run his business it makes Ken's contribution to his town more meritorious. As president of the local R.S.L. sub branch in 1974-75 and as the R.S.I. Welfare officer since 1967 Ken devoted a lot of time to helping war widows, incapacitated servicemen and legatees

His services to the football club, Hall committee (especially as a noted M.C.'), Tourist Association, Marysville Bowling Club and Gallipoli Park committee were valuable contributions to his town.

I am proud to have been treated as one of Kens family many times and I am sure a lot of others would endorse my remarks because of similar experience they have had with Ken.

The only thing I can say now seeing you have "Sassanoffed", Ken is that, like the beloved "A" model, they just don't make em like that anymore.
