At a meeting Chaired by Cr Jack Haycraft in the R.S.L. Hall on 16/5/77 the "Marysville Community Chest" was formed. The organisation will be responsible for running Bingo in the town when the necessary legalities are finalised.

The original idea of forming the Community Chest came from Mick Halliday who was keen to see that no one particular group gained a monopoly of the

running of Bingo in the town.

Membership of the Community Chest is Limited to Sports Clubs and Community groups and is in three categories with member organisations joining at \$20 per share.

Distribution of half yearly profits will be on a ratio of 3:2:1 depending on the number of shares a particular

group holds.

Looking at this in another way-for each \$30 to be divided up, the various member groups wil receive as many \$ as they have shares...Golf Club \$3, Football Club \$3, R.S.L. \$2, Community Care \$1 etc. etc.

Member organisations will provide a minimum of 6 helpers each week on the same ratio as the profits are divided. e.g. 3Golf, 2 Bowls, 1Angling Club members will work on one night.

It was considered essential that the Bingo nights take place on the same night each week. Friday or Saturday nights were both considered with Saturday night having the most support. The organising Committee comprises Mick Greatorex(Chairman), Mrs H.Hill

(Deputy Chairman) Mrs A. Norman (Hon. Sec.) Ted Greatorex(Treas.) Mick Halliday, Alan Walker and Cheryl Norman (Committee Members).

Shareholdings will be reviewed at an annual meeting when the organising

committee also will be elected with members eligible to stand for re-elec-

tion.


