

### FIRE BRIGADE.

The Marysville Fire Brigade has been struggling for years to keep active & in that time, we have had some good members as we now have Also we are fortunate to have some very expensive and up to date equipment. Some has been

bought from Brigade funds and some has been given to us by the C.F. i. One of the items given to us by the C.F.A. is the "Fire Reporting System". This is a very complex telephone apparatus which has proved to be very successful.

Operation of the F.R.S.

There are four telephones in Marysville that are hooked up to the F.R.S. These are in the homes of....

Trevor Harrow Peter Halliday Jock Henderson

and also at Barton's Drapery Store. If someone dials the Brigade (633266) the four telephones listed above start ringing with a distinct, special tone. If one phone is picked up the others will continue to ring until picked up. If no phones are answered then (after 25 seconds) the siren will sound.

This very rarely happens and we have only experienced this once in two

years.

This is only a brief summary of the F.R.S. for the people who are not aware of the workings of the local Brigade. The main reason for the F.R.S. is to intercept all fire calls and assess them for urgency, validity etc. However, over the past six months, the

F.R.S. has been activated at an alarming rate by people mis-dialling other phone numbers. The C.F.A. has told us that there is a fault somewhere at the exchange but to find th it we have to ask the caller what number he or she is dialling. After we have collected this inform-

ation from the caller we can then

attack the problem. .The real problem is that when we answer the F.R.S. and say "Marysville Fire Brigade", the caller becomes very shy and replaces the 'phone on the hook without a murmur. So next time you dial a number and someone says "Marysville Fire Brigade", just apologise and tell them the number you were dialling. You don't have to identify yourself.
