

The meeting is to determine parent support for a scheme to encourage inter school cooperation and also school-community interaction. A pilot meeting at the Narbethong school last week examined the basic ideas of the scheme and decided to call a general meeting of parents. The first meeting was attended by representatives of the three School Councils and teaching staff. The plan will call for the purchase of a small bus. Finance for the scheme will, hopefully, come from a T. Commonwealth Government Grant under the Innovations Program. The whole plan, should it come to pass, will be under the control of School Council members from the thro schools. Submissions for Grant money must be in by September 12 so it is vital that things get under way. Without the full backing of all parents the scheme will not work so you can see that it is important that you attend the meeting next Tuesday to make sure that a true "yes" or "no" vote is effected.
