A number of school children have been inspected following a health discussion between pupils and nurse. Head lice has not been found amongst these girls and boys.

combs and hats is to be discouraged. The lice are the insects found in which may be seen as white specks attached to the shaft of the hair close to the scalp. The lice suck

blood and irritate the scalp causing scratching and resulting in infected sores.

The treatment is simple. "Parid" or "Quellada" shampoo may be bought a thomough shampoo and rinse.Normal drying, brushing and combing follows. Repeat shampoo three days later.
