FOREST FIRE VION STREW BIOLD IN BROUND At 6.30 p.m. Wednesday evening, a fire broke out in heavy timber country on the property of D. Juergens. The fire started from an old tree that had evidently been smouldering since late October when Mr Juærgens burnt some logging slash. and fundounded .m. qt is ysbarent yarava

The fire quickly spread in surrounding scrub but prompt action aided by the time of day confined the main area burnt to approximately one ha.

The most alarming feature was the way with which big old trees(stags) caught alight and showered burning material long distances. A chain reaction wasset up and a series of these stags caught alight up the steep slope. Forest Commission men and workers from Mr Juergens' property watched these tree all night putting out the burming limbs as they fell. On Thursday Forestry crews felled these trees and watered them out.
