MARYSVILLE WATER.

value or and and the work

On Wednesday evening a Public Meeting at R.S.L. Hall attended by about 60 people had the chance to get answers to some important questions put to the Marysville Waterworks Trust Commissioners.

The meeting was ably chaired by Brian Oliver who kept the discussion on positive lines.

There were three main areas of interest. which concerned those attending and questions were directed to Commissioners Gianforte, Cuzens and Gould and to the Trust's Acting Secretary Mr. Max Cockerell.

1. CHLORINATION.

Why is Marysville water to be chlorinated ?. For many years the Health Department accepted an E.Collie count of 6 organusims per 100 ml% water and water having this reading (or less) on a test sample was classed as " pure ".

However, the Health Department has changed its standards so that now, for water to be classed as " pure ", it must have a zero reading relative to E.Colli organiisms. How do you ensure a total absence of E.Colli ONLY by chlorination.

2. DIRT IN WATER.

1968 apparently was the last year that the Forests Commission was asked to flushout the Reservoir on the Steavenson River with high power pumps. Several people at the meeting on Wednesday said.... "The silt is at least four feet deep".. and blamed this condition for the poor water flow and also for the dirty condition of the water,

The Trust Commissioners gave an undertaking. that the Forests Commission would be approached to again clean out the reservoir.

3. QUANTITY OF WATER.

For at least ten years the Trust has been aware of the fact that the water supply needed augmenting and has had studies carried out to determin the feasibility of adding Taggerty River water to the present system. The State Rivers & Water Supply Commission has consistently refused to U.K. this concept.

The quantity of water available of course determines water restriction over the summer period and if these will be in force this summer, a plan to divide the town into several areas each

Several ladies at the meeting made strong statements about the varying and irregular times of flushing the mains. Apparently household laundering suffers when the above process is carried out because muddy water comes through taps. This year the Annual Reports will be printed

The inconvenience of this was accepted and attempts will be made to regularise flushings and notify times thereof.

Communication of knowledge is vital and Marshall Hull, summarised the importance of people knowing what is going on very well indeed. He made the point that there is no doubt in his mind that the Water Trust members work hand and for the best interest of the town but that they have fallen down badly in communicating to the people.

This constructive criticism was received in the spirit in which it was given and Trust Commissioners have promised to inform the public about their work in future.

In relation to communication, several people felt that it was not sufficient just to follow the legal requirements to place a notice in the Alexandra & Healesville papers only. The information must be spread by all possible means.

Primps, however, as members of the public we also have a duty to buy a Healesville or Alexandra paper and check the public notices section as a matter of course to make sure we keep abreast of

matters as well as expecting news in our local news sheet. Max Cockerell, in answer to a question, stated that members of the Trust are appointed by the Government in Council for a terr of four years. The local Member of Parliament. on advice from the Trust, puts forward the name . of the person willing to fill the vacancy arising

People who are interested in being considered for future vacancies can leave their names with Max Cockerell and also the Trust will publicly notify the townspeople of any coming vacancy so that a public meeting can put forward its ideas on suitable candidates.

Alan Sund extended a vote of thanks from townspeople to past Chairman of the Trust, Jim Darmody, for his many years of hard work. This was carried by applause.

In summary it can be said that the most important points to come out of the meeting are -

1. People demand to know what is going on.

2. They are vitally interested in the improve ment of Marysville's water supply both in quality and quantity.

3. The Trust Commissioners have a very difficult job.

4. The Trust will make every attempt to carry out this difficult job even more efficient
