COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS by Eric Walker, President Pennysylvania State University, June 1970.

Ladies and gentlemen of the graduating class I am not going to tell the older generation how bright you are. Nor am I going to say we have made a mess of things and that you are the hope of mankind.

I would like to reverse the process. I will re-introduce you to some of the most remarkable people ever to walk the earth; people you might want to thank on this graduation day - your parents and grand-parents. Let me tell you about them ...
