T. V. Reception in Marysville.

In December it became known that there was a possibility that Channel O would be changed to Channel 10.

After advice from the local technichans, the Marysville Tourist & Progress Association wrote to the Postal & Telecommunications Department (30.12.78) seeking advice of the proposed change and explaining the T.V. difficulties in Marysville and the importance of Channel O as one of the very limited channels available.

The interests of residents and visitors were stressed and an assurance sought that any alterations would improve not destroy T.V. in Marysville.

A reply was received on 12th February, here in part recorded for your consideration and we

The proposal, which is still under changes to GLV (Latrobe Valley) from channel 10 to channel 8 and to the Alexandra translator of GMV Shepparton from channel 10 to channel 11. This latter change also involves an increase in power from 50 to 200 Watts.

The change in channel for ATV is being proposed as part of an overall plan to rationalise the usage of the television channels so that they can be used to provide additional television services in the future. It is an unfortunate by product of the change, that the marginal reception of ATV in Marysville, which is outside the normal coverage zone of the Melbourne stations, will deteriorate. The cause of the deterioration is a fundamental physical limitation in the propogation of VHF frequencies in mountainous areas and there is nothing that However, there will be some slight compensation in that the increase in power of the Alexandra translator will improve the reception of the Shepparton station to which you make reference.

My department is very conscious of the reception problems in Marysville and is constantly seeking means whereby reception can be improved. Whilst I am not in a position to make definitive proposals at the present time, you may be assured that the situation is under active examination with a view to the provision of at least one commercial station signal of viewable quality.
