UNEMPLOYMENT PROJECT.

The Alexandra Manpower Project has started operations. The project

covers the Alexandra, Marysville and Eildon areas.

The project is concerned with the problems of unemployment. The aims of the project are : To work with the existing Commonwealth Employment Service people, in an attempt to provide positive and permanent job opportunities; to provide communication services for the unemployed and employers; to provide availabilit of and access to information; to maintain an inventory of work available, both permanent and seasonal; to provide interview training; to establish a skills inventory; to encourage employers to participate in work experience schemes covered by workers compensation insurance, on job training and the employment of apprentices; to attempt to maintain self-respect, morale and enthusiasm in people who find themselves unemployed; to investigate the possibilities of job creation schemes. Initiated by a community group the project will operate from an office established with the support of local Council. The office is situated in part of the Shire Supper Rooms, near SES.

A committee of volunteers will man the office Monday to Friday, 12 to 5 0 p.m., Thursdays 12 to 7.0 p.m. and Saturday mornings. It is hoped that the manpower project will eventually be funded by the Commonwealth Government under a Commonwealth Youth Support Scheme. The first part of this agant has bodn approved. This initial grant will allow a full-time officer to be appointed for a six-week period to study unemployment and the needs of unemployed people in this area. The Manpower office will continue to function during this time. It is envisaged that as a result of evidence gathered, a full-time C.Y.S.S. project will be established in the area.

The committee of the Manpower project would appreciate any offers of assistance from any interested groups or individuals. Any person employed or unemployed will be welcome to visit the centre. It is hoped that the office will be able to provide more than just job information for people who are unemployed. Employers who would like to help with the scheme or who have work available are asked to contact any member of the committee or write to: The Alexandra Manpower Project, Box 35, Alexandra. HEAD LICE.

Instances of head lice have been reported by mothers of children in the district. This condition is treatable, and may be prevented. The lice cause itching, and will lead to scalp sores through scratching with finger nails.

Head lice spread from head to head as children play and work closely together, therefore it is advisable for parents to check all members of their families. SIGNS TO LOOK FOR. 1. Constant scratching of scalp.

11. Small white specks (nits) attached the he hairs near their roots. 111. Small insects amongst the hair,

(the adult lice).

TREATMENT: "A200 Application" is used to wet the scalp and hair, left on for 10 minutes, then washed thoroughly and rinised. The hair is then combed through with a fine tooth comb to remove the lice. Other applications are also available for the treatment of head lice.

2. Sheets and pillow cases should be b boiled, or machine washed in hot water and hung in the sun.

3. Brushes and combs should be cleaned and disinfected.
