## HOW SHOULD WE THEN LIVE ??"

This ten episode documentary film will begin on Sunday - 29th - at the Anglican Church in Marysville, at 7.30 p.m. Written and narrated by Dr. Francis Schaeffer, the films trace the rise and decline of Western thought and culture,

The films, plus a companion volume with the same title, are the crowning work of forty years of study by the Swiss based American theologian and philosopher. Shot in some 100 locations in 12 countries, the project took two years to complete at a cost of \$1.1 million.

Time magazine called Schaeffer a missionary to the intellectuals, and thousands of students, for the local Lions Club and great curiosity seekers and drifters have sought him out at L'Abri, his home in the Alps.

There he and his staff have developed a reputation for their intellectual presentation of Christianity.

Each of the 30 minute films focuses on a major historical age, beginning with the Fall of Rome up to the present day which he calls, The Age of Personal Peace and Affluence. In the final film, he reviews the last two decades and concludes that man's only hope is a return to Truth as revealed in Jesus Christ through the Scriptures.

This series is a joint effort by all the Churches of Marysville and will alternate between Christ Church and the R.S.L. Hall.

These films are for everybody not just the so called church people, they will certainly be thought provoking and perhaps some may see them as controversial, and don't let the word, intellectual worry you, they are very much for you and me.
