OPTICAL SERVICES

SOME FISHY ADVICE.............

To catch a fish in the streams around Marysville you require a light rod and reel, or pole and light nylon line - 3.5kg would be strong enough. Use small hooks - size 8 would do.

Bait is best found in the area. Worms are easily found in the spring or winter, in a damp area, under bits of wood, tin or old bags. Grasshoppers are the best bait to use in the warmer weather and are easily caught in the paddocks.

If you like to use an artificial lure, buy a small spinner that looks like a fish or a wobbler that flashes in the water when it is spun in.

If using a sinker with your worm or grasshopper, use a light one only.

Remember when you approach the stream that a fish is easily frightened, so be quiet and cast your line while standing back from the edge of the pool, starting from the bottom and casting your way up the pool.

There are plenty of good pools to fish in the stretch of the Steavenson River from Buxton to Dickinson Farm, and then the Taggerty River takes over. The most accessable part of this stream is up the Talbot Drive, where the road follows the river.
