Dear Residents,

A lot of people ask, "Exactly what is Red Cross?" Briefly, it's a worldwide organization working for the comfort of people in most disaster areas such as flood, fire, famine, cyclones and war stricken areas of the world.

In our Buxton Unit we are always ready to assist in any of the above, such as local bush fires, loss of a family home and people lost in our bush.

Most of the time our members engage in happy meetings, planning for a few social events which have the effect of drawthe community together while raising funds to help people in trouble. Some members knit jumpers and socks with wool supplied by Red Cross headquarters. These knitted items are used by families burnt out of their homes or destitute for some other reason, or sold at the city Red Cross Fair.

Our two favourite community efforts are the Buxton Red Cross Children's Concert and the Poster Competition, both of which are to be held on 19th August. These involve local schools and Guide and Scout organizations. Posters have to be in by 5th August. The second event is the Buxton Red Cross 5th Annual Bikethon. This year's route is Taggerty to Thornton, via Alexandra - a distance of 20 miles. This is s real fun day, and you may be surprised at who you might meet if you rode your bike with us. There are spare bikes available if you care to try it. Lunch provided. The date is Tuesday 14th October. More information later.
