Ratepayers will remember the recent announcement that, due to new procedures and regulations outlined in a recently passed Act of Parliament, the proposed annexation to Alexandra would not proceed.

The Shire of Alexandra has contacted the Minister requesting that the matter proceed in the near future, and sought the support of the Shire of Healesville in an approach to the Minister.

At its meeting on Tuesday evening the Healesville Council debated at some length the whole matter and voted against supporting the annexation and therefore in favor of retention of the East Riding within the Shire of Healesville.

This is a change of policy and the Minister will be informed accordingly.
