Our Link with History

from E Postlethwaite

Marysville's history is closely linked with that of the Keppel family, enduring to the here and now.

Just pause to reflect on the number of features, both natural and man-made that are named in memory of this pioneering family.

Do you know of others which could be added to the following list?

Keppel's Falls, Keppel's Lookout, Keppel's Track, Keppel's Valley, Keppel's Court, Keppel's Hut, Keppel's Ridge, Keppel's Creek.

As of Monday 30 October we may add yet another – Keppel's Hotel.

Geoff Hyland from the Cumberland has purchased the hotel, from Michelle Williams and re-named it, in memory of 'the good old days'.

Back in the late 19th Century, in the early days of Marysville's settlement, the Keppel family ran the hotel as the Australian Hotel.

Maurice John Keppel came to Australia on the good ship 'Joshua' in 1851/52, and first settled in Melbourne.

He married Mary Grainger and moved to Marysville where he took over the Marysville Hotel.

In 1864, a subdivision of township allotments of land on Paradise Plains was offered for sale and Maurice John Keppel was one of the first purchasers.

From 'Vagabond Country' edited by Michael Connor:

"Down again into a hollow in the

heart of the hills and 15 miles out of Fernshawe, Marysville is before us.

This pleasant afternoon's drive ends most pleasantly at Keppel's hostelry – best of all the inns on the Yarra Track". April 3 1883.

The hotel was renowned far and wide for the impressions plus of the satisfied guests – take a look at the visitor's books (late 19th century onwards) in our Local History Centre in Pack Road (open Sat & Sun), they are priceless.

A Mr H.P. Singleton wrote in 1885:

"The Australian Hotel is decidedly the best out of Melbourne. The proprietor deserves the greatest credit for the manner in which it is conducted. The Bath is charming. We regret the weather was bad and look forward for another visit".

Let's leave the nostalgic past and dwell a little on the present and future.

A brand new menu will be available in the bistro. Chefs Peter Weedon, Simon Milkovic and Callum Moss have been working together to create a pleasing menu to suit all comers – even the children.

Keppel's Hotel will boast an extensive range of fine food at realistic prices. In the public bar great value meals for lunch and dinner will be available.

Happy Hour will extend to two – from 6 to 8 pm on Fridays. Pots only \$1.80 and free bar snacks should keep everyone happy.

There are Pool and Dart competitions 'in the pipeline'! Watch this space in the Triangle for details.

Put your name down for the big 'Sweep' for Melbourne Cup Day (Hurry!).

There will be a Dance on NEW YEAR'S EVE! (again).

Dance to the top Melbourne Covers Band – 'The Kool Ade Katz' in the grand ballroom! (More news later).

We wish Geoff and staff the success enjoyed by M Keppel and family with the Keppel Hotel, Marysville.

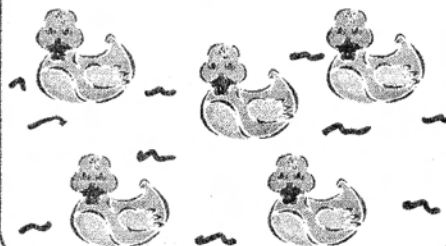

Gardening Corner

Flower of the Rainbow – The Bearded Iris

Noticed some stunning clumps of colour towering in spring gardens recently?

Could be tall bearded Iris, easy to grow here because they require both the winter cold and a good baking in the summer sun. Very rewarding for very little effort. They are also available in dwarf sizes which flower earlier. And don't forget the lovely Louisiana Iris for a wet spot or pond, a most versatile plant.

Iris was the Greek name for rainbow from ancient mythology, and all the colours of the rainbow are available in this lovely clumping rhizome. Peak flowering time is late September to late November, and December to March is the time to plant new stock or tidy and divide old clumps. Divide every 3 years or so to maintain a tidy bed.

Choose a sunny, well drained position with sun for at least half the day, raise the bed if necessary to get the drainage (no wet feet!), and work in a balanced fertiliser but not animal manure, less nitrogen and more potash and phosphate is required. The Iris also prefers a dressing of lime each year.

Plant the rhizome almost on top of the soil easing out the roots underneath which should be encouraged to descend deeply. Cover the rhizome with 1 cm of soil to prevent sunburn and water until established.

Ideally, the new plant should be the offshoot from the old root which will have lost some of its vigour. Keep the bed free from weeds and ground covers. This plant needs winter cold (even frost), and dry summer

heat to make flowers. Top up the fertilising before flowering in August and after flowering in December as they are greedy plants, and your flowers will be happy for years, delighting you and the neighbours. A good once-a-week watering in hot weather is usually sufficient.

If you are trying to choose an Iris from the many mail order catalogues available, don't forget to look at some of the cheaper "old fashioned" varieties. Most are just as good as the new releases and only cheaper because they are "yesterday's show winners".

There are local growers and enthusiasts who will also steer you on the right path to growing these beautiful garden flowers, which are easy-care and relatively disease free.

Councillor Lyn Gunter comments

Murrindindi Valley Economic Project

It was with a great deal of pleasure that the Mayor, Councillor Chadband, the CEO and myself attended the announcement that the Murrindindi Valley Economic Project has received funding from the State Government. Mr Brumby, the Minister for Economic Development announced the grant of Friday at Seymour. The project was initiated by ex-Councillor Kevin Bellingham and the then Director Economic Initiatives, Ian Abernethy, through the North East Victoria Consultative Committee. The Federal Government accepted the project for funding on a three-way bases, and now to our great pleasure the entire project will be completed. It is envisaged that this project will bring employment to the Shire and in particular the Murrindindi area. Our thanks must go to both tiers of Government for the funds to enable this project to be fulfilled.

Streamflow Management Plans

Having attended both the Yea and King Parrot Environmental Streamflow meetings, I would like to pass on once again the importance of these meetings and make residents aware of the process. My understanding of the streamflow plans that are being developed is that they will not only affect these two waterways within our Shire, but are pilot programs that will continue across the State for all waterways. I believe that the King Parrot Creek draft recommendations are at the forefront of all plans being undertaken within the State.

The Committee is having some very lengthy discussions on the impact that these strategies will have on irrigation and domestic users within the Shire. Once the draft recommendations have been accepted by the Committee it is planned to have public meetings for community input. Please keep an eye out for where these meetings will be held and have your say.

Fuel Prices

The Federal Member for McEwen, Fran Bailey, now has a website "<http://www.franbaileymp.com>". On this site you can provide information on fuel prices to our Member. I would encourage you to have your say and visit the site so that our Member understands how we feel about the prices we are paying for petrol, diesel and LPG.

I have been writing to both State and Federal members regarding fuel prices and I am sure that the campaign by the MAV will have an impact if we all take just a few minutes to let the powers that be know how we are feeling.

Planning Matters

Council is looking at changing its present policy on excisions within Rural zones. Currently the planning scheme allows for excisions within these zones but it is envisaged that this may be removed. It would be of value to hear residents' views on this subject. I would encourage residents to contact the Shire staff and Councillors on this subject.

Flood Response Guidelines

These Guidelines are presently being printed and will be distributed. The rain over the past weeks has been great and I hope that residents may realise that we must always be prepared for the unknown. Within the past years of drought one would have never thought that we could have had the amount of rain we had in the past week that brought minor and major flooding throughout Victoria. These guidelines are being issued to you so that you can make plans for your household in the event of a flood. As with fires you must make your own plans and be as prepared as you can be. The Shire is working in partnership to help you as much as it can. Once these guidelines are delivered we would most certainly be interested in any information residents may have that is not included in the booklet.

Until next time please remember that Shire Staff and Councillors are available to assist you.

The nine day ride is fully catered, and there is extensive back up for holiday makers including luggage transport, a licensed café under canvas, massage, full medical team, and bicycle repair facilities.

The Lake Eildon Tourist Operators Action Committee was pleased at the result of the Government infrastructure grant of \$66,000 for the preparation of a long term Business Development and marketing Strategy Plan for the businesses in the Shires of Delatite and Murrindindi.

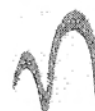

We are looking forward to a visit from the Premier Steve Bracks on 13 November 2000 to give him a first hand account of our situation. There are many people who have supported this group and we thank everyone who has contributed their time and effort to ensure there is a viable tourist industry around Lake Eildon today and long into the future.
