Ever heard of Rogaining?

We received a call last Sunday morning, 12th, to say that there was a group in town that we should perhaps talk to. Something called Rogaining.

After a little 'super sleuthing' we met up with the group's Volunteer Recruitment Officer, Ainslie Cummins, in the car park at Crystal Journey.

There was quite a crowd. An estimated 100 or more cars were parked in a cordoned off area along the front roadside of Crystal Journey –the group's weekend headquarters.

After the 200 competitors departed, I met the organisers who were congregated around the hash house tent. They were all wearing navy blue shirts upon which was printed "The Mad Hatter's Rogaine"

TN: The first question must be 'What is Rogaining' Ainslie?

Ainslie: If is the sport of long distance cross country navigation, on foot, in teams of 2 – 5 people. They have to find as many checkpoints as they wish in the bush within a certain time frame. This Marysville event was over 6 hours. Some weekend events go up to 24 hours.

In this event, there were 50 checkpoints available for the contestants to find. You choose your own team and each team member has to punch an electronic tag to prove that they have indeed visited that point. These checkpoints can be located in any order and each has a different point value.

Weeks of planning goes into each event The co-ordinator and course setter for this weekend was Kath Copland who had a support team of around 40 people who put out the markers and provided admin and catering. This course was set over 50 sq kms, throughout the town and surrounding forest.

For this particular weekend we featured a 'Mad Hatters' day on the Saturday. Many of your readers would have seen a lot of hikers looking very strange due to their crazy hats. Most of the markers for this event were around the town, the bakery and lolly shop to name just 2 and a drink at the pub was another option.

Sunday was a more serious competition day and this weekend actually marked the 30th anniversary of Rogaining. We celebrated with cake and candles.

Rogaining is an International sport which started in Melbourne by the Surrey Thomas Rovers (a Scouting organising) and Melbourne University Mountaineering Club. It grew out of their 24 hour walk.

TN: Where does the name come from?

The name Rogaining comes from the originators: Rod, Gail and Neil Phillips.

TN: This is a large crowd Ainslie so we can see how popular your sport is.

Ainslie: This is not a large crowd. We have had 400 over this weekend (some come and stay from Friday night - good business for your town - others arrive for a day visit on the

Saturday or Sunday). Now 850 is a large group for us.

TN: And so many young children and teenagers. It looks as if it is a healthy outdoor event for families.

Ainslie: Yes, we have them from babies in backpacks to 80 year olds. The sport caters for all levels of fitness.

And by the way, yesterday's event was won by 2 of your locals, Dr. Lachlan Fraser and Robin Rishworth.

TN: I have to say that we can hardly be surprised at that! And to summarise Ainslie?

Ainslie: There are 3 elements to doing well, to be a champion:

1. Navigational skills. 2. Route Planning (contestants are given the map 2 hours prior to the event). 3. Physical fitness. The person who runs the hardest may not win the event – they may not find the checkpoints.

And many people take this sport quite seriously but some others only manage a few hours before returning to hash house for some more food.

Murrindindi Shire Council CEO Visiting Schedule



The CEO, Danny Hogan is available to meet with residents and ratepayers on an appointment basis at various locations throughout the Shire on a rotating basis.

Drought Strategy Committee Update

The Drought Strategy Committee met on the 15th of November. The members discussed a number of items including the new Drought Information brochures. These brochures are available at all of council offices, libraries, general stores, hotels and stock agents.

An Information session on maintaining stock during the drought was held in October and if you would like to receive the information from this session, copies of CD's of the discussions along with the drought brochure can be obtained by contacting the shire or they will be available at the Yea Show.

Goulburn Valley Water have advised council that domestic and stock standpipes will be made available at Alexandra and Yea. Terms and conditions for these standpipes include costs for water and triggers for restrictions. There is an existing commercial standpipe at Alexandra and the committee will work towards the provision of a commercial standpipe for Yea. The capital costs and ongoing maintenance for these standpipes are to be funded by Council.

Discussion has taken place with Goulburn Murray Water to install bores at Kinglake, Yarck and Highlands. If these were provided the water would be for stock and domestic use only and not for drinking water. We will work with Mitchell Shire Council for the possibility of a bore being installed at Highlands. At this stage there is no further word on bores for other areas.

Goulburn Murray Water and the Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority are working together to provide information and guidelines for access points to the Goulburn River. Suitable filling sites have been located and will be advised. Guidelines are still being finalised. Information regarding river flow, may be accessed by contacting Silvio Fontana of Goulburn Murray Water.

A Shire wide advertising campaign to "Shop locally for Christmas" is underway. Due to grant funding be made available five workshops for businesses will be held in each local area over the coming weeks.

An application for local business forums to discuss drought – retail sector, tourism sector, and aquaculture/horticulture/viticulture is being considered. Further information will be provided on this as it becomes available.

A Rural Financial Counsellor, Ken Slatter, is continuing to consult at Alexandra on a fortnightly basis. For bookings ring Ken direct on 0407 844 558.

The Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority is looking at a Drought Employment program - fencing, soil erosion, pest plants and animals and stock containment areas. If this program is successful it will be advertised in the coming weeks, so watch out in the employment section.

Berry Street held a Food Share Cooperative meeting on the 16th of November. The idea is similar to a Food Bank – basically creating storage and handling facility for donated foodstuffs.

Watering of the public areas was raised with some members saying they believe we need to have an area where people can sit in green surroundings. Especially our tourists.

We had a query on the risk of Blue Green algae developing in our water systems. Goulburn Murray Water have advised that there is a possibility of this later in the season. If it does occur, there would be concerns about contamination. This is being monitored and will be managed if and when it occurs.

The next meeting of the committee will be held on the 6th of December. If you have any information you would like to pass on or want to know about please do not hesitate to contact us.

SPECIALIST FIRE RAPPEL CREWS READY FOR SEVERE SEASON



Department of Sustainability and Environment (DSE) specialist rappel firefighters are currently completing an intensive two-week training program at Mt Buller in preparation for a severe fire season.

DSE rappel crews are often the first form of attack for fires in remote areas of the state, deploying from helicopters to try and control the spread of fire until other resources arrive.

The firefighters rappel down ropes from a hovering helicopter to reach the fire ground, in areas where helicopters cannot land.

DSE North East Manager of Fire, Peter Farrell, said the highly trained firefighters are critical to making an early assessment of the fire.

"DSE rappel and general firefighters are among the best trained firefighters in the world and play a vital role in preventing and suppressing wildfires in our parks and forests." he said.

"Once they are on the ground, the firefighters assess the fire's potential and, if possible, start directly fighting the fire," Mr Farrell said.

"The rappel crew may also prepare a helipad nearby to help transport additional firefighters and equipment to the fire area."

This year DSE is training nine "rookies", who have joined the specialist unit after prior general firefighter duties with DSE. Each rappel crew comprises a crew leader, rappel dispatcher and five crew members.

The training will see the firefighters rappel from various heights up to a maximum of 100 metres.

DSE currently has four rappel crews in training for the 2006-07 fire season. The crews are based at Heyfield and Ovens for operations in the forest areas of Gippsland and north east Victoria.

Mr Farrell said before being considered for a rappel position, firefighters must first satisfy an intensive aerobic fitness and muscular endurance evaluation.

"The importance of DSE's rappel crews reaching the fire quickly and commencing suppression works cannot be underestimated," he said.





New Garbage Service to Commence in January 2007

From January 2007, the Murrindindi Shire will commence its new kerbside garbage collection service with our new service provider Cleanaway. The garbage collection service will introduce 120 litre mobile garbage bins, replacing the current 140 litre mobile garbage bins. The change to the new 120 litre bin is in line with industry best practice guidelines

"Murrindindi Shire Council is committed to managing waste in a way that protects and preserves our natural environment and by replacing the current 140 litre mobile garbage bins with 120 litre mobile garbage bins, we will be reducing the amount of waste being disposed of at Council's landfill" said Danny Hogan, Chief Executive Officer.

In mid January 2007, Council will be delivering the new 120 litre mobile garbage bins to all properties eligible for a kerbside garbage collection service. The bins will have a dark green body and a red lid, which reflect the colours being adopted across the State. As with your recycling bin, the new garbage bins must remain with the property if it is sold, as they are owned by Council. However, the occupier of the property is responsible for looking after their bin.

As the 140 litre mobile garbage bins currently in use have been purchased by property owners, they do not need to be returned to Council. If you do not wish to retain your 140 litre garbage bin, you can contact Council to discuss the possible alternatives available to you.

However, please remember that your 140 litre bin cannot be used for your household collection service after the delivery of your 120 litre bin.

Mayor's Chair

On Monday the 13th of November the first Murrindindi Shire AusIndustry Business Awards were held. The responsibility for checking and treating head lice rests with the parents and practical advice and support is provided. Thank you to the Kinglake West residents who raised this topic. We hope this information will assist everyone in the community.

GOOD PERSONAL HYGIENE TIPS TO COMBAT GASTRO

A surge in gastrointestinal cases has prompted a reminder about the need to practice good personal hygiene as a way of preventing the spread of unwanted illnesses, Victoria's Chief Health Officer Dr Robert Hall said last week.

"Most gastro is caused by the common and highly contagious Norovirus," Dr Hall said.

"This is easily spread from person to person, initially in household settings, but it can find its way into hospitals, aged care facilities and child care centres from the general community.

"These viruses can cause vomiting, diarrhoea, abdominal pain, muscle aches and pains and fever. The illness can last for 24 to 48 hours, but those who fall ill are regarded as contagious for 48 hours after symptoms stop.

"Personal hygiene is a very effective way to reduce the spread of germs that cause viral gastroenteritis. Hand washing should be second nature to everyone, especially at key times such as before eating, after going to the toilet, after handling pets and changing nappies," Dr Hall said.

Hand washing is a simple step-by-step process:

- Wet hands with warm water and apply soap;
- Lather for 10 to 15 seconds;
- During the lather, pay particular attention to the backs of hands and fingers, fingernails, fingertips and the webbing between fingers;
- Rinse hands under running water;
- Dry hands with a clean towel.

Washing down contaminated surfaces with hot, soapy water followed by appropriate disinfectants will further reduce the risk of spread of infection.

People suffering from gastro should stay home from work, school or child care until 48 hours after their symptoms have ceased.

Dr Hall said all the eastern states were experiencing similar problems.
