



## A special Sunday morning in Buxton

Some days are just a whole lot better than others! Last Sunday I spent 2 delightful hours visiting and chatting with Motorhome Club members at Buxton Reserve. This group would have to be described as HAPPY and STRESS-FREE. Yes, in capitals!



As I sat amongst the forty one members, under a huge shady tree, I was offered pancakes and a cuppa. "Oh, am I interrupting your breakfast" I asked? "No this is morning tea; will you have yours with maple syrup or lemon and sugar?" I took the lemon and sugar. The best I've ever tasted!

There was so much cheerfulness and bursts of laughter that I had trouble noting all of the wonderful comments I was hearing.

**Carol:** I belong to a Chapter of the club called 'Eastern Rosellas'. We were first a group of solos but now we have some couples; many of them met through this club". Some travel for part of the year - others have sold up their homes and live permanently in their MH (motorhome).

This is our 5<sup>th</sup> annual meeting at Buxton. Many of us have a genuine fondness for the area and some a family history here. For most this is one venue we will not miss. Audrey is having her 77<sup>th</sup> birthday this week and was dancing at the Buxton Pub last night. And she bought the tee-shirt to prove it.

**TN:** 77 years of age and still driving yourself solo around Australia! But like everyone here you look so healthy, I sus-

pect you are not the only one who looks decades younger than you really are.

**Jean:** Buxton is my favourite get-together. I come from Gippsland but would drive across Australia to get to this particular meeting spot.

**Dorothy:** My parents lived here in the 70's when Buxton had a much smaller population. We owned Moondai Farm and nieces and nephews attended local schools. One of them is coming to Buxton this year from the Whitsundays to celebrate her 50<sup>th</sup> birthday. I love it here. I spend 8 months of the year on the road.

**Mike:** I am on the road full time - have been for 7 years. Done 195,000 kms and the wheels have been around 308,000,000 times. But don't ask me the time of day!!!

Most of our readers will know Cliff Charlton. Until a year ago Cliff had a property at 60 Eagles Nest.

**Cliff:** For 12 years I travelled every year to Queensland in the winter. Now I have bought a home in Lilydale and spend 4 months a year in my MH.

This is not a singles club but a support group for solo travellers. It is such a free and easy lifestyle - just like being part of a huge family. You can voice your true feelings whenever. If feeling stressed you can 'do a runner'. And the next time you turn up at a group meeting you do not have to explain and no one will ask why. Everyone has a mobile phone and everyday, at the same time, you can call if you are in trouble and someone will soon be with you.

**Yvonne:** I was widowed, got myself a MH and travelled up the east coast of Australia. I met Graham in March last year. He was also a solo club member and we got together. We have just sold our vehicles and bought a new larger one together. We live mostly on the road but rather than 'solos' we are now 'fossils' (friends of solos).

This is such a strong support group. At

the moment we have a member who is ill. She was taken to hospital yesterday and one of our group is looking after her little dog and we will look after her van and keep an eye on her. Another time when another solo was sick, a member answered her call then drove her, in her van, to where she needed to be. He then got on his bike and rode the 60 kms back to his MH.

Twice a year we have a major rally. 205 solos met in Wellington, NSW last August. The following week at the CMCA Rally there were 1200 MH's and 2000 people.

**Jack:** I call my daughter regularly and she immediately asks "Where are you now?" Ah yes, you have got to live long enough to get your own back on your children.

**TN:** The vehicles vary from smaller homes, so compact and yet with every imaginable item you could need, right up to larger 5 star homes with dishwashers and every conceivable luxury.

**Cliff:** Each year, here at Buxton, we take up a collection and donate the CFA and the Reserve Committee. This year we have collected \$400. This makes a total \$1200 over the years we have been coming.

**Yvonne:** We don't allow ourselves to be pinned down. If anyone asks when are we moving on, I answer 'About half-past'. Don't know which hour. Or which day for that matter - but about half past!

**TN:** Buying a MH, joining a motorhome club and hitting the road sounds very attractive! I would like to personally thank the group for their outstanding hospitality. They really are a joy to hang out with!

The group wishes to thank the Buxton Pub for supplying their bus for the group whilst in Buxton.

### CHRISTIANS AROUND THE WORLD JOIN TOGETHER TO PRAY FOR THE WORLD'S NEEDS

On Friday, 2<sup>nd</sup> March, over 3 million people will be taking part in a Day of Prayer that circles the globe from the time the sun rises over the islands of Tonga until it sets off the coast of the islands of Samoa.

The central act of worship will be a service using material prepared by Christian women in Paraguay, from the heart of South America.

This will be an exciting day. Services will be held in over 170 countries and islands world-wide. In Victoria alone there will be more than 300 services across Melbourne and country areas. The services will bring together women, men and young people from every background, and a wide variety of Christian traditions.

'United under God's Tent' is an appropriate theme because World Day of Prayer unites people internationally and between denominations, not just on the day, but in the extensive preparations that are necessary.

In this year's service the women of Paraguay bring the needs of their country to us. Paraguay has had a turbulent history, marked by two major wars and military dictatorships. Since 1989 there has been a return to democracy. Progress towards social and economic rights has been slow. But the people are young and full of enthusiasm. The prayer must be that their energy will be used positively and for the common good.

Service resources are available in various formats, including contemporary worship ideas, a children's program, a youth service, large-print abridged service for retirement villages and nursing homes, together with the main service.

The Yea Wetlands were a great location for a World Wetlands Day celebration on Saturday 17 February. Over 100 people attended the day, and enjoyed a wide variety of activities. There were talks about river critters, freshwater fish and wetland wildlife; plenty of games and funky art & craft for kids; and an electrofishing demonstration in the Yea River. Perhaps the greatest hit was The Connies; a pair of performing tram conductors who distributed a range of colourful swap cards featuring Victorian plants & animals, and entertained everyone with great stories about each card subject. There was free fish & chips, fresh fruit & salads, and even the opportunity to taste some carp. Given the heat, many children also had great fun playing in the river.

The free freshwater circuses that are currently running across the Shire are being implemented to connect communities and support individuals and families, and are supported by the Murrindindi Drought Strategy Committee. A range of business and community support service representatives, such as Rural Finance Counselling, are participating in each event, enabling access to drought support services and advice in an informal setting. The events have been organised by Alexandra staff from the Department of Primary Industries and the Department of Sustainability and Environment. ## Cambarville Sawmill Community Reunion.

Past residents of the tiny Cambarville Sawmill community will meet for a reunion at the deserted mill site near Marysville on Sunday 11 March. In its heyday Cambarville consisted of a sawmill, office building, blacksmith shop, 16 mill houses, 7 single men's huts, boarding house, and a one room schoolhouse. It had its own water supply system and in latter years electricity was supplied from a generator at the mill.

Cambarville was established in 1939 following the 1939 bushfires to salvage and mill the giant Mountain Ash forest in the area which had killed in the fire. Mill owners Alex Cameron of Toolangi and Fred Barton of Marysville combined their surnames to create the name Cambarville. The sawmill was burned down twice in its history, the second fire in December 1970 forced the closing of the site and the end of a part of sawmilling history in the area.

Cambarville State School No. 4600 began taking students in 1943 and on its closure at the end of 1967 had educated 204 students. Past students have fond memories of growing up in a most beautiful part of Australia, amongst the tallest hardwood trees the southern hemisphere.

# Parks Victoria Advises

## Fox Control -

### Bellef Creek section of Yarra Ranges National Park

Parks Victoria is committed to protecting and enhancing the natural values of parks and reserves across the State. Examples of this conservation management are the control of introduced plant and animal species which can impact on these values.

As part of an ongoing strategy notice is hereby given that Parks Victoria will be laying buried baits containing Sodium Monofluoroacetate (1080 poison) on public land for the control of fox. Baits containing 1080 poison will be laid from **Thursday 1 March 2007 until Saturday 31 March 2007.**

Baits will be laid at strategic sites and other known areas of fox habitat within the parish of: **Taponga.**

1080 poison signs will be posted throughout the baited area and members of the public who are living, visiting or working in the above named parishes are advised to take particular care not to disturb or interfere with bait stations. Domestic dogs and cats are particularly susceptible to 1080 poison and should be under effective control, muzzled or kept away from the poisoned areas.



### Healthy ageing - stay physically active

Only around one in 10 Australians over the age of 50 exercises enough to gain any cardiovascular benefit. Some estimates suggest that about half of the physical decline associated with old age may be due to a lack of physical activity. It has been suggested that people over the age of 65, more than any other age group, require adequate fitness levels to help them maintain independence, recover from illness and reduce their high risk of disease.

Without regular exercise, people over 50 can experience a range of health problems, including: **Reduction in** muscle mass, strength, physical endurance, coordination, balance, joint flexibility, mobility, cardiovascular and respiratory function, and bone strength. **Increase in** body fat levels, blood pressure, susceptibility to mood disorders, such as anxiety and depression, and risk of various diseases including cardiovascular disease and stroke.

**It is never too late to get fit.** The human body responds to exercise, no matter what its age, and there are many health benefits. If you are over 40 years, obese, suffer from a chronic illness or have been inactive for some time, it's best to check with your doctor before embarking on any new exercise routine.

- Choose activities you find interesting. You are more likely to keep up with an exercise routine if it's fun rather than a chore.
- Exercise with friends. Make physical activity an enjoyable social occasion.
- Safe, easy and comfortable forms of exercise include walking, swimming and cycling.
- Start off slowly and aim for small improvements. Keep track of your progress in a training diary for added motivation.
- Don't overdo it.
- Choose appropriate clothing, footwear and safety gear.
- Don't let yourself dehydrate - drink plenty of water.






