Now Ready for this Snow Season!

You just can't keep a great village down! Marysville has pulled out all stops to be able to cater for visitors and locals for the snow season. And it all begins this Saturday, June 6.

What do people need when they come through the Village on the way up to Lake Mountain? They want a toilet stop, hot food and drinks and snow play hire. And so they shall have it!

Marysville Central Refreshment Marquee: Thanks primarily to Chef Michael Jaeger and Billy Hawes of the Australian Children's Trust, and with the support and help of many others, the idea for this Marysville Central Refreshment Marquee has come to fruition.

The marquee will have a solid floor and heating. Michael is hiring a real kitchen with full sized equipment to enable him to prepare hot food. Soup, curries, pastas, pizzas, donuts and other delights are planned on a rotational basis. Variety will be the keynote.

Special thanks to Simon Cuzens for the use of the site and also to Prestige Party Hire who have gone way beyond the call of duty in providing the marquee. A mobile refrigerator has been donated free of charge by Shane Oliver of Austral Insulation, Victoria Pty Ltd.

Portable public toilets will also be on the site.

Michael Jaeger has a solid history in Marysville's restaurant/café industry. He

was chef at Kufstein Inn before taking over the management there. He put in a pizza oven and did home deliveries. This was back in the early 90's. Michael then spent some time teaching cooking at Swinburne before going on to other upmarket restaurants prior to settling back in Marysville as Chef at the Cumberland.

Recently Michael brought the Fairy Floss machine to the village. It will be used this weekend on Lake Mountain. He did Kids Day at Crossways and, with help from staff at Swinburne, made over 350 cup cakes for the occasion.

James Fraga will also be in the marquee whilst his old premises are being rebuilt. He will feature his famous Fraga's baguettes as well as his wonderful coffee.

Councillor Comment

Recently I attended the Annual Awards Dinner for the Kinglake Ranges Community Paper, the Mountain Monthly. This year owing to recent circumstances no awards were given out but the guest speaker gave a very enlightening account of his experiences in Iraq in 2004 and in Kinglake during the fires.

Lt Col Craig Madden was in charge of the Australian Defense Forces in Kinglake during the first two weeks after February 7 and the comparisons between the aftermaths of both events were very compelling. After the presentation Craig and his Warrant Officer Kel Eaton mixed with the seventy people in attendance exchanging experiences and advice. It was a very uplifting evening. Both men gave outstanding service during their time in Kinglake and will be remembered for their professionalism and compassion.

At the last meeting of Council, a list of expenditure on emergency works since the fires was presented. This list exceeds six million dollars paid by this council that has a rate revenue of about nine million dollars annually. This expenditure covered many areas not normally dealt with for example over \$463,000 was spent on cleaning and replenishing water supplies, \$110,000 on fuel for generators, \$356,000 on the hiring of generators etc, and \$345,000 on works at the Flowerdale temporary village. The biggest item was over \$2.5 million for works on local road clean up and safety, much of which was spent on damaged trees. Even though Council expects to have this money reimbursed by the State / Federal governments it does give some idea of the scope of the current financial burden on the Murrindindi Council.

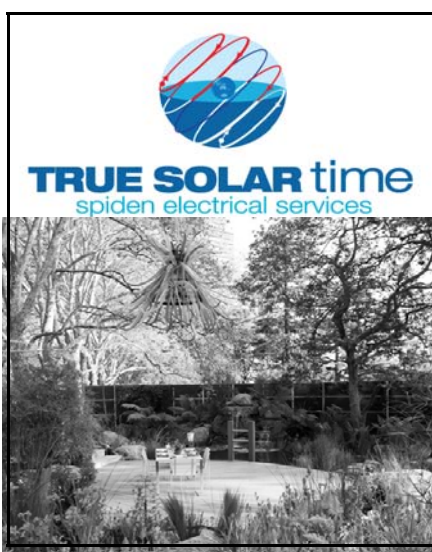
Recent announcements by the State Government for relief in

permit fees and rate assistance have been most welcomed. The latest announcement by the State government on 28 May was for a grant of \$263,000 being for extra assistance in rebuilding early year services and facilities in Marysville, Flowerdale and Kinglake, as well as assisting with the off set of the cost of other temporary services.
