

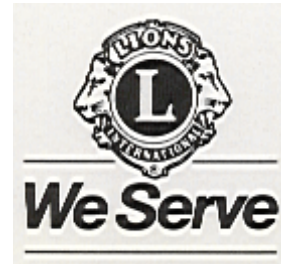

Four Fire Surviving Koalas to be Released at Taggerty

Your Invitation to Witness & Celebrate!

Join the happy band to witness 4 healed and happy Koalas which will be released at Taggerty on Saturday June 13th. (Tune into UGFM this week for the timing). Afterwards a celebration drink at Taggerty General Store awaits you!

In the days following the fires, Sandice McAulay and Ray Goss opened their store cottage for use as a triage centre for AWARE (Australian Wildlife Assistance Rescue & Education) as they worked over a period of 45 days to rescue 53 animals. Some of these animals were so dehydrated and burnt that to move them even an hour away would have meant their demise. In having the triage centre so close to veterinarians, who manned it along with AWARE carers and nurses, meant they could save more than in most fire affected areas.

In a letter to Sandice and Ray, Michelle Thomas of AWARE wrote: "Your constant support of our efforts and volunteers was truly remarkable and buoyed us to know we had support in such a large scale operation" It went on further. "Your store became the focal point for not only our volunteers to return at the end of an arduous day but also a hub of hope for local people to be able to reconnect with their friends, neighbours and loved ones. Many days I watched people sit and wait to see who would return to your café for a coffee, which you provided free of charge, for

many foot sore and tired members of the Taggerty, Buxton and Marysville area".

Sandice told TN that the AWARE people were so very dedicated and committed and did an outstanding job - it was heart warming to have such dedicated volunteers in the area. They were frequently out in the search areas at dawn not returning until after dark.

Community Rooms available at the Taggerty Store for Counselling.

Sandice: On behalf of the people of Taggerty, who are hurting so badly, we need to make sure they receive any help and assistance they possible can. And there are more than you could know about. We have streets in Taggerty, not visible from the highway, that were totally decimated. There were over 20 homes lost that we are aware of.

With this in mind we have repainted and set up two rooms in the cottage here for Mitchell Health and any other service which could provide bona fide support. A weekend resident has offered to do free massages every second weekend and this has been gratefully accepted. More practitioners/counsellors are required - can you help?

Maybe a group would like to use one of the rooms for meetings. Maybe some ladies would like to form a sewing or craft group? We can provide a room for you. Call us Sandice or Ray on 5774 7201.

Meanwhile you are invited to participate in the release of the four koalas, one male and three females, who re-

covered from their bad burns, all helpers are encouraged to attend. The koalas will be released back near the plantation at the bottom of Knaffl Road early afternoon of Saturday 13th. Tune into our local UGFM radio this week for exact details.

After the release Sandice and Ray invite you to then join them in a celebration drink at their Taggerty General Store and Post Office.

Marysville and Triangle Development Group (MATDG) Advisory Group formation

As you may be aware, the MATDG formed after Black Saturday 7th February to be a representative mouthpiece of the affected communities of the Triangle region to liaise with the various development and reconstruction authorities.

The genesis for MATDG started with the Hon. Fran Bailey, Federal MP for McEwen who recognised the need for a community based group to assist in the rebuilding and reconstruction efforts. The objective was to form an interim group to be the voice of the local communities of the Marysville & Triangle districts. The interim MATDG committee formed and Doug Walter was elected Chairman. Doug is currently Chairman of MATDG.

Those currently on MATDG were drawn from local unelected individuals and others who put their hands up early to assist with the rebuilding. All these people are working as unpaid volunteers giving their time and expertise freely to assist the community during this national disaster.

Moving on...

The committee achieved a huge amount since the fires – Community meetings including the May 3rd Celebration meeting, communication of community needs and the opening of the temporary village are proof of this. However, this small group of volunteers needs to move beyond an interim group to become an elected community group. They also need the assistance of the many Triangle residents who have offered to help. To this end, two things are happening:

- Saturday 13th June, MATDG elections (see the notice in the triangle and on the MATG and Marysville Community websites). Membership forms and nomination forms are being distributed through the community; and the
- formation of the advisory groups

Get involved....

The advisory groups are being formed **now**. This is:

- To assist with the huge task of rebuilding;
- To bring together people who have volunteered to assist into community groups with common interests;
- To assist in the next steps of the Marysville Urban Planning process which commenced on 3rd May;
- To ensure all sectors of the community are engaged and looking for representation prior to the 13th June MATDG AGM and elections;
- To acknowledge and engage those who have volunteered through VBRRA, MATDG, MOCA and those already involved in community activities aligned with the advisory groups;
- To continue to meet the priorities of providing food, clothing, housing, fencing etc!

If you have already volunteered, you should be contacted shortly. If not, please consider getting involved. In the words of Nigel Bell *"if you don't know where you're going, you'll probably end up somewhere else"*. Get involved to ensure your voice is heard.

MARYSVILLE WELCOMES

Maxx Cooper Garnet

(and his mummy & daddy of course!)

Young Maxx, together with his mum and dad, Sharon and Nathan Garnet, is settling into his Marysville Village lifestyle very nicely!

Born at just 25 weeks, with prolapsed umbilical cord and without lungs, baby Maxx, is now off his oxygen for 15 hours each day! That's incredible progress, all things considered.

Nathan told TN: *Three years ago we had a little girl who we lost. Maxx was born last August 24th and survived against all odds. A number of times we said our goodbyes to him. He was administered steroids as a last attempt with the risk of considerable side effects, and that night I sat beside his cot all night and sang 'Over the Rainbow' to him and the next morning he opened his eyes for the first time in days!*

He has come along so well now, weighs just on 10kg and is gone from being on oxygen 24 hours a day down to being off it for 15 hours! He is the greatest little boy. He is on solid foods now and if it wasn't for the oxygen he would be just like any other normal baby.

Maxx will go to school here in Marysville

When we came we were told that it would take 25 years to be considered a local, however everyone has been so welcoming and so generous that we already feel a part of this community.

Every day is a new beginning here! We live in our new home in the midst of all this (as his eye strayed over the forlorn landscape). And when the sun shines we turn a blind eye. Sharon and I had been coming up to Marysville, and the Lolly Shop, on our way to or from staying in Eildon, and always said that one day we'd love to live here. 3 years ago we bought the land. We lived in Mornington and then 18 months ago moved in with Sharon's mum and dad in Rye whilst we built up here.

We were due to have the final inspection on our newly built home two days after the fire.

Someone asked me if I felt guilty that our new home survived and I said no, I feel blessed! We had to have the guttering a few windows and insulation replaced and the whole house repainted inside and out.

I travel to Collingwood each day to work and do it in 1 hour and ten minutes when there are many logging trucks on the Spur, but I love that drive. I am a General Manager for a company called Pup-Pee Solutions www.thepetloo.com and in the next few months will be able to work from home one to two days per week. I think that we can have a very good life ahead of us here and we all can't wait for the community to blossom again.

The people of Marysville and District welcomes the Cooper family into our community.

\$600,000 Tourism Recovery Funding for Murrindindi & Mitchell

Bushfire recovery in the Murrindindi and Mitchell region will be aided with a \$600,000 allocation from a special State & Federal funding package officially announced by the Victorian Minister for Tourism on Friday.

Tourism Victoria, the body with overall responsibility for the recovery effort has appointed Graeme Haycraft, to manage the Murrindindi Mitchell tourism recovery efforts.

Mr Haycraft has been actively involved in the Australian tourism industry holding senior positions in major tourism attractions, city tourism & convention authorities and State and Federal tourism commissions.

Over the past 30 years he has marketed Ballarat's Sovereign Hill Goldmining Township, promoted Melbourne with the Melbourne Tourism Authority and spearheaded Australian tourism efforts in the United Kingdom and Ireland with the Australian Tourist Commission.

In announcing the appointment Tom Smith, Regional Tourism Advisor for Tourism Victoria said Graeme was an obvious choice not only for his vast tourism marketing experience but also because of his family connections to Marysville and knowledge of the area.

Graeme also has a solid knowledge of regional Victoria as he worked as Independent Chairman for six Victorian Tourism Regions including Great Ocean Road, Yarra Valley, Dandenongs & The Ranges and Goulburn Murray Waters.

Mr Haycraft's first task is to form a steering committee comprising key local tourism professionals to assist in the development of a strategic recovery marketing plan. Local businessman Roger Wootton has been appointed the independent Chairman of the group. Mr Wootton has extensive knowledge in international tourism aviation marketing.

Mr Haycraft believes that close consultation with the tourism businesses in the region is paramount to the success of the recovery plans. A series of consultative meetings to be held throughout the Murrindindi & Mitchell Shires will be organised as a matter of priority. Dates to be advised shortly.

The tourism industry in the Murrindindi and Mitchell Shires were very seriously affected by the bushfires, not only in terms of the loss of buildings and infrastructure but also the heavy loss of income to those still open for business.

The extra funding will provide a much needed boost towards promoting the attractions of the area, inviting visitors to return and support the local businesses which rely on the tourist trade.
