## STARTING AGAIN!

Lynne Phelps has been in the bakery business for 25 years, beginning in 1984 in Alexandra and moving to Marysville 15 years ago. Her Marysville bakery was one of the very few buildings to survive Black Saturday. We asked Lynne to share her current situation with us.

*Since reopening after Black Saturday I think of it as a new era – it's like starting business all over again – every day is an unknown challenge. It's not like the normal situation when you get out of bed every day knowing what you are going to face.*

*There has been so much support though from volunteers. People of the district have been marvellous and even visitors who have come in for lunch have stayed on for a couple of hours to clear tables. One elderly lady of over 70 years of age, from Brighton in Melbourne, came every day for 2 weeks – drove up and back every single day – to help out.*

*I am so very grateful to everyone for their support – for what they've given me, especially all those locals who have volunteered. And we all need to be supportive of all of the other businesses as they open up.*

*So many people have dropped in food supplies, others quilts and one gentleman dropped in 40 paintings for those who would have lost theirs in the bushfire. Whatever is left over he has told us to sell and use the money for the recovery of the community.*

*People want to give – they feel it is the way they can show how they feel for us so I have a bucket on the counter of the bakery for donations. SES and CFA will share in the cash donations which have been dropped in the bucket.*

*People are still dropping in their change; at*

*the very beginning we had up to \$600 donated some days.*

*Some volunteers are waiting to help with the gardens. We have lots of plants stored here ready for when the time is right. Many others are coming back to support the town and will continue to come back when businesses get up and running again.*

**TN:** And you Lynne. What about you?

*When I first came to Marysville I had a dream to have a little shop with a few chairs. I ended up with 180 seats inside and out! I love it all. I do enjoy the customer contact, especially the oldies. And when bus groups come in. At the moment we are doing longer hours because we need to have egg and bacon rolls and coffee ready for the Grocon people by 6am. The days are long.*

*Even the day trippers are very supportive. Those who have been to Marysville before are devastated by what they are seeing.*

*Ten years ago we started doing Marysville tours to bring people to the town. The tour would include Bruno's Art and Sculpture Garden, a NarbyValley tour, the Alpaca Farm and the Blueberry Farm. Then to keep the circle going we offered something a little different: a BAKEHOUSE TOUR. Clubs would bring people up for day, look at how we bake and prepare the food and then eat it for lunch.*

*And then we did the 2 FAT LADIES' TOUR – they were myself and Joan Noke, but we weren't really fat. We'd take them through the bakery, show them how we baked bread and scones and how to make different pastries and then when it came out of the ovens they'd eat it for lunch.*

*Now we are starting to bring these same people back again so as other businesses start up these tourists can support them too. We have lots of clubs who want to support us. If you have bus tours every day it keeps your business going.*

## MARYSVILLE FIRE BRIGADE NEWS

Sunday last, 14th June, saw a big day unfold at the Emergency Services Complex in Marysville.

The day started at 9.30 am with a Brigade management team meeting followed at 11.30 am by two donation presentations.

Firstly a party from Irish Murphy's Pub in Geelong, consisting of Morrie and Rhonda Pieper with Jason France and Laura Hayden, gave us a donation of \$4,038.55, being money amassed from a fundraising day held earlier in the year where they conducted raffles and also auction a regular patron, know as one of the Corner Boys, for a day's labour. By all accounts this was a good day with a live band donating their services, and to top it off, a donated barrel of Guinness.

Next, Lynne Phelps, owner of the Marysville Country Bakery, presented cheques to the value of \$6,081, being half share from a donation bucket placed on the counter after re-opening in April.

The other half going to another service group.

We thank these people and their patrons for their generosity and as usual the funds will be used for Brigade and Community projects.

We then call upon Peter Creek, Operations Manager Region 12, and Peter Rice, Group Officer, Alexandra Group of Fire Brigades to re-present Long Service Medals to brigade members who lost them in their homes on Black Saturday.

Peter Rice, who has had over 30 years association with the Marysville Brigade, first as Regional Officer with Region 13 and later with Alexandra Group, commented that although he had been involved in many medal presentations, this was the first time, and in unique circumstances, that he had been called to re-present medals.

A great day was had by all present, the event being the first time we were all together since February 7th.

A fantastic luncheon was next, thanks to the efforts of Judy Ratcliffe, our newest member. Welcome aboard Judy!

## Seasonal road closures help protect forested areas

The annual winter closure of selected roads and tracks within State Forest throughout the north east will be introduced today, following the June Queens Birthday long weekend.

Roads and tracks are closed seasonally in some areas of State Forest and Parks to protect track surfaces, water quality and the forest environment.

According to DSE North East Land and Fire Area Manager, Alan Dobson, driver and public safety was also an important issue when determining which roads would be temporarily closed.

"The impact of the recent fires and loss of vegetation will increase the potential for land slips and water damage to roads and tracks," he said.

"It's important that during winter, when the forest is most vulnerable to damage, that the environment is protected."

This year the general road closure period will be from June 11 to October 29 inclusive with an option to extend closures if required. Closed roads and tracks are marked by signs and in some cases locked gates.

Mr Dobson said while many tracks and camping ground remain open during winter, some will be closed to allow for rehabilitation, particularly those affected by the bushfires.

DSE advises travellers to check the status of roads and tracks within State Forest by contacting the DSE Customer Service Centre on 136 186.

## **DSE to reopen Marysville office and depot**

The Department of Sustainability and Environment (DSE) will reopen its Marysville office and depot, following the devastating February 7 fires.

DSE Murrindindi Land and Fire District Manager, John Steer, said works are currently being planned to repair fire damage at the site, prior to the return.

"Returning to Marysville is an extremely important part of the recovery process for our staff, many of whom were personally impacted by the fires," Mr Steer said.

"While our crews have been undertaking major rehabilitation works in and around Marysville since the fires, we see it as a priority to have them back working from the local site as soon as possible."

Since the fires, staff based at Marysville, many of whom lost their homes, have been based at Alexandra.

Mr Steer said it is hoped DSE staff would be back working from the Marysville office by the end of July.

"Our staff are overwhelmingly positive about returning to Marysville to work," he said.

"The environmental recovery from a natural disaster of this nature will take time, however DSE feels very strongly about working collaboratively with communities to overcome many of the challenges."

DSE has had a presence in Marysville since around 1953, initially as the Forests Commission and regards itself as an integral member of the local community. The current building was opened in 2003.

Staff were working from the office on February 7 as part of the region's preparations for the extreme fire conditions. Mr Steer said some staff were required to seek refuge at the site when the fire hit the town.

The office and depot was one of only a small number of buildings in the township which were not completely destroyed by fire. It suffered damage to the main office block and several sheds were destroyed.

## Community Advisory Groups Formed for Bushfire Recovery



Victorian Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery Authority

The Murrindindi Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery Committee (MBRRC) has moved swiftly to establish a number of community advisory groups representing fire affected areas within the Shire of Murrindindi.

The role of the Community Advisory Groups is to provide advice to MBRRC on the planning and rebuilding of their communities.

Membership of the Kinglake Ranges and Marysville District is complete, with further members required for the Melba Highway and King Parrot Valley.

The groups comprise community members who submitted an expression of interest to Council together with representatives selected from a number of community groups formed in the weeks immediately after the fires and in some instances community elections.

Commenting on the formation of the advisory groups, Deputy Mayor and MBRRC member Kevin Bellingham said 'thorough community consultation is a vital ingredient in the recovery process'. "The advisory groups ensure a broad representation of people in local communities and create a proper and effective forum where their input can be channelled."

Local advisory groups will also have the ability to recruit additional members when a need for a particular skill is required or if representation from a specific section of the community is identified.

Names and further details of those accepting the invitation to join an advisory group will be announced shortly.

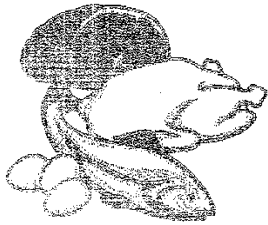

### MARYSVILLE ART SHOW

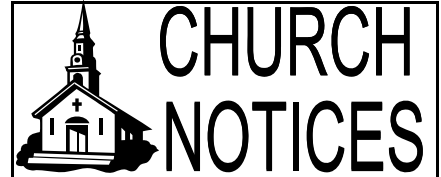

## New Firewood Distribution Plan For Bushfire Affected Communities

In an attempt to ensure free firewood is being equitably and fairly distributed for bushfire affected residents a new management and control distribution plan has now been produced.

Working in partnership with Berry Street, the Murrindindi Shire Council has developed the plan for the eastern half the shire. The plan ensures the available firewood is more closely targeted to those who need it most. It aims to particularly target those seeking emergency relief or to those residents who have a Health Care Card.

As part of the new plan, a central distribution point has been established in the east of the shire replacing the previous stockpile sites in Buxton and Marysville.

The new plan sees council contractors continuing to split bushfire salvaged trees into firewood. Berry Street is coordinating distribution activities with a range of volunteer groups to arrange home-delivery to individuals living within the shire.

Commenting on the new arrangements David Hall, of Berry Street said "The new plan is designed to ensure firewood reaches those who are most in need. With snow already falling in many parts of the shire and the likelihood of a cold winter ahead, it is imperative bushfire affected residents are given top priority.

Discussions are also underway with other agencies to make a similar arrangement for the western areas of the shire including Kinglake and Flowerdale.

Residents wishing to apply for firewood should do so through their case managers. Others can apply directly to Berry Street's Alexandra office on (03) 5772 3383.
