## Business Recovery Information Sessions Provide Helping Hand

Murrindindi Shire Council in conjunction with the Rural Financial Counselling Service recently conducted a series of business recovery information sessions throughout the shire. More than 100 businesses attended the sessions and were provided with a wealth of information to assist in the wake of the bushfires.

The sessions included presentations from many government and aid agencies. Topics covered included financial counselling, legal issues, accountancy, and insurance matters. Participants also learned how agencies such as Centre Link, Australian Taxation Office (ATO) and Murrindindi Shire Council can be of help.

Key messages included:

**Financial Advice** -The Rural Financial Counselling Service offers free financial advice call 5735 4342

**Legal Matters** - contact Victoria Legal Aid to find out about all your rights. For any matter relating to the bushfires including insurance matters their free legal help line is 1800 113 432

**Insurance** - The Insurance Council of Australia can give advice on the most effective dispute resolution procedure. They also provided details on how to insure for the future. 1300 728 228

**Accounting** - CPA Australia can help with getting financial accounts back in order together with how to wind up an existing business and understanding what financial options are available. 1300 737 373

**Small Business Mentoring Services** - The Small Business Mentoring Service is a free service available for everyone affected by the February Bushfires. They can help with applying for grants and can assist with marketing, sales and websites 9879 4476

**Centrelink** - welfare support services and a gateway to other government agencies. Many affected by the fires may be unaware of their entitlements and it's worthwhile visiting one of the Centrelink hubs set up for bushfire affected resident to discuss your individual situation. Call 1800 050 004

**Taxation** - The ATO are being very lenient with BAS and tax returns for those affected by the fires. The ATO can help get your tax affairs back in order Call 1300 304 975

## SUSTAINABLE BUILDING WORKSHOP

The Murrindindi Climate Network in partnership with the Moreland Energy Foundation is hosting the second in a series of sustainable building workshops to provide information on the different options available for rebuilding after the fires.

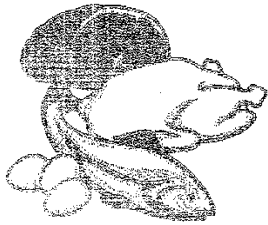

## Councillor Comment

Councillors and Council Staff have been busy working on the Council Plan that lists the work and major projects that we aim to complete over the next four years. It forms the basis for the Council's annual budgets.

We had completed our first crack at the job in the last week of January but the subsequent fire events meant that just about all of that work has had to be redone. Our fundamental aims of having strong vibrant communities living within healthy environments remain the same but the pathways to getting there have undergone major revisions.

The new plan will now focus primarily on the first year with bushfire recovery being the dominant issue to be addressed. That is not to say bushfire recovery will be the only issue but clearly it will be the major target on the radar. We need to integrate all the Bushfire Reconstruction Authority work with the rest of the Council's activities. We will have to ensure our budget also accounts for our reduced rates income while including all grants and subsidies from State and Federal Governments.

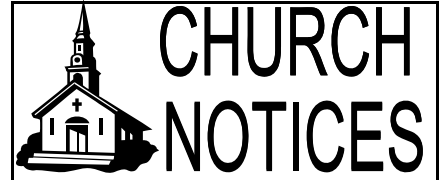
To meet the wide variety of demands, in time to have a budget for the coming financial year, we intend the plan will have the first year's activities well defined but the list of activities for subsequent years will not be described in fine detail. One of the tasks for the next financial

year will be to complete the detail for the last three years of the Plan. A fundamental driver of our considerations is to show we are providing value for dollar and ensure we are being efficient in the use of our resources. The impact of the global economic crisis would have provided enough challenges for us. The fires have doubled the issues to be resolved.

All of this work has to be done at the same time as staff are undertaking their increased workload as a result of the fires. The State Government has extended the deadline for getting the work done but to make sure we are acting to best manage the Shires finances, we are aiming to only take part of the available time extension as we want a solid budget that covers a full year.

When the draft Plan is completed, it will be published for comment and I encourage all of you to review it and provide input. Don't hold back in quizzing your Ward councillors on the proposed activities and later, ask us about the budget provisions. The plans for our communities will only be successful if we all recognise the priorities and need for trade-offs in these tight economic circumstances. Then we can all take ownership of the Council Plan and work together to restore and enhance the Shire.

## New Firewood Distribution Plan For Bushfire Affected Communities

In an attempt to ensure free firewood is being equitably and fairly distributed for bushfire affected residents a new management and control distribution plan has now been produced.

Working in partnership with Berry Street, the Murrindindi Shire Council has developed the plan for the eastern half the shire. The plan ensures the available firewood is more closely targeted to those who need it most. It aims to particularly target those seeking emergency relief or to those residents who have a Health Care Card.

As part of the new plan, a central distribution point has been established in the east of the shire replacing the previous stockpile sites in Buxton and Marysville.

The new plan sees council contractors continuing to split bushfire salvaged trees into firewood. Berry Street is coordinating distribution activities with a range of volunteer groups to arrange home-delivery to individuals living within the shire.

Commenting on the new arrangements David Hall, of Berry Street said "The new plan is designed to ensure firewood reaches those who are most in need. With snow already falling in many parts of the shire and the likelihood of a cold winter ahead, it is imperative bushfire affected residents are given top priority.

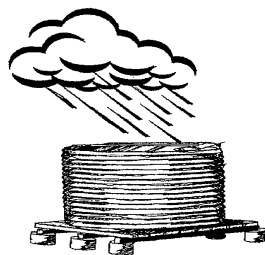

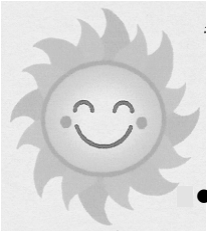

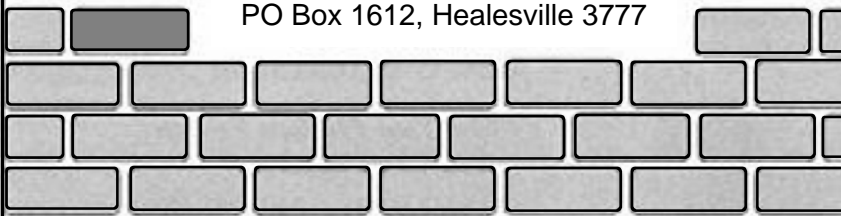

## Council Rate Waiver for Bushfire Victims

Murrindindi Shire Council will waive five months of rate charges for ratepayers directly impacted by the Black Saturday bushfires.

The council has acted swiftly to pass on the benefits following revisions to the State Government's natural disaster funding arrangements.

The decision, ratified at Council's meeting on 27 May 2009, sees a reduction, on a pro rata basis, for five months of rates, garbage and recycling charges covering 7 February to 30 June 2009.

Those benefiting from the decision include ratepayers whose primary residence or business was destroyed or rendered uninhabitable as a direct consequence of the Black Saturday bushfires.

Ratepayers who meet the new criteria, set by the Department of Treasury and Finance, and who have not yet paid their rates will be sent a revised notice whilst those who have already paid will be given a refund.

Properties affected by the fires but not meeting the criteria are also subject to a supplementary valuation. A revised rate notice based on the amended property valuation will be issued.

The new rate charges and a detailed explanation of criteria will be sent to all relevant ratepayers shortly.
