From Germany with Love...

Last week this writer was privy to a very special practice recital by visiting classical Violinist Lucas Barr, who has arrived from Germany to do a fund-raising Melbourne performance for Marysville and the surrounding districts.

Lucas recently performed at the Lincoln Centre in New York. His audience today though was of just two – Pam from Crossways, being his mother, and myself.

We were utterly overwhelmed! This was due to the combination of the gloriousness of this world standard performance and it's being presented in this historical old Inn which had, against all odds, survived Black Saturday's tragic events.

This presentation of Schubert's "Trout" Quintet, played on violin by Lucas (and CD practice backing tracks) was to me almost eerie in its beauty. How could something so magnificent be happening in the setting of the aftermath of so much tragedy and destruction? Schubert's "Trout" quintet ... so tender and poignant, but with courage, has been sensitively and perfectly chosen for the occasion of a fund-raising concert for Marysville.

I sat mesmerised, my emotions oscillating between the glorious and the tragic. This recital seemed so unreal after the experience of the sheer terror of running for our lives from the fires just a short time before.

Pam feels that the funds raised by this event in Melbourne could be used on an ongoing basis to support Music and the Arts in Marysville. These exceptionally gifted artists, wishing to support and nurture this region, are all musicians of excellence and world acclaim.

Joe Chindamo, one of the finest Jazz pianists in Australia, is currently touring world wide and last week won the Apra Award for Australia's Best Jazz Composition with his beautiful work "Something will come to Light" from his CD "The Romantic Project".

Lucas' story

Lucas loved the sound of the violin long before he could pronounce the word. He started lessons at 5 years of age with Elizabeth Baker. By 8 he was studying with Prof Brian Finlayson in Melbourne. He was 9 when he said "Better get used to it mum, by the time I'm 15 I'll be in Germany – I should do the language!" The plan was pursued; primary school, Vic Boys Choir and then years 7-11 at the Victorian College of the Arts. He was a founding member of the Junior Strings of Melbourne and the Australian String Ensemble between ages 11 -15, touring Japan, Europe and Australia. In 1990 the opportunity was there to go to Austria with his Professor Finlayson.

Amid this exciting time there were also worries of how to finance his plan. Lucas used to 'busk' a lot in Box Hill with a little sign on his violin case saying "Please help me to get to Europe". He was heard by a beautiful lady, Rita, who was overcome with his potential and, unbelievably, decided to help him! She generously financed his first year in Austria! He then went to Cologne on scholarship and continued studying hard with many of the world's best. This was challenging – the discipline of hours and hours of practice, often down to his last \$5, homesickness and a new culture to adjust to, Lucas found the courage to keep going, to pick himself up from the 'knocks' and start again!

Eight years Cologne, 5 years Berlin with the Berliner Sinfonie Orchester and then Cologne where he now lives with his wife Susanne and their two beautiful children. He plays with the West German Radio Symphony Orchestra (WDR) also Concertmaster with the Cologne Chamber Orchestra and violinist with "Crux Quartet".

Lucas grew up knowing Marysville as the 'half way coffee stop' on the way to the family holiday house in Woods Point. His desire to help our town is heartfelt and compassionate – he won't give up!

Community Grants Program

These grants are made available to community organisations to assist with the purchase of equipment, running events, renovations to facilities or to assist in the promotion of the wellbeing of our communities. Applications will not be considered for activities that could be described as an organisation's core business, administration or day-to-day operation.

Applications for amounts to \$500 do not require matching contribution. Matching cash or in kind labour is required for amounts between \$500 and \$5000.

Why not submit an application for that much needed assistance for your organisation?

Application forms are available at all shire service centres and can be downloaded from the Council website.

Applications for the current round of Community Grants close at the end of September.

Waste Management

Waste from the bushfire cleanup operations in Marysville has been disposed of in the purpose built cell at the Alexandra landfill over the past weeks. Approximately 21,000 tonne of material, consisting predominantly of soil and ash, has been deposited in the cell, with an estimated 10,500 tonne of material still to come.

- Replacement of the retaining

walls and reconnection of underground power to the Marysville Resource Recovery Centre has been completed. The site reopened to the public on Wednesday 20 May and has operated under extended hours to end of June.

- Garbage and recycling services have commenced from the Marysville Community Village.
- To date 373 household recycling bins and 343 household garbage bins have been delivered to properties to replace those damaged by the bushfires. An additional 42 commercial bins have been delivered to commercial premises.

Bravery Awards

The role of the Royal Humane Society of Australasia is to give public recognition to people who have risked to save or attempt to save the lives of others.

The Black Saturday bushfires were a tragic and catastrophic event that gave rise to many such acts of bravery.

REMINDER TO GET YOUR DOMESTIC FIREWOOD PERMIT THIS WINTER

The Department of Sustainability and Environment (DSE) is reminding Victorians to obtain a domestic firewood permit before collecting firewood this winter.

Domestic firewood permits are required to collect or remove firewood for domestic use and are available through DSE offices and authorised retail outlets.

DSE's Director of Forests, Lee Miezis said, "A domestic firewood licence or permit is typically issued for a short term and for small quantities of timber only and the firewood must be paid for in advance of collection."

Domestic firewood permits will be issued again this winter for firewood collection in Victoria's public forests including the Murray River Park, Shepparton Regional Park and Gunbower, Benwell and Guttram State Forests."

Domestic firewood permits will also be available for the proposed Bar-mah and Gunbower national parks.

"In the proposed national parks, people will still be able to collect residual timber from designated firewood collection sites, following sawlog harvesting operations that occurred before 30 June 2009, until mid-2011," Mr Miezis said.

"When people are issued with their permit, they'll also be provided with a map showing the locations where they can collect firewood."

The Victorian Government's Firewood Strategy for Public Land, due out by the end of the year, will provide guidelines on how firewood is to be sustainably managed and collected on public land into the future, including in river red gum forests.

"Following the release of the Firewood Strategy for Public Land, regional implementation plans will be prepared to ensure that a sustainable supply of firewood is available to regional Victorians."

"We are aiming for the regional implementation plans to be in place before mid-2011, which will enable us to make the transition to the new arrangements in the river red gum areas much sooner."

Firewood collectors must carry the permit at all times and show it to any employee or agent of DSE upon request.

The cost of a domestic firewood permit varies, depending on the species of wood and costs associated with making domestic firewood available.

Generally, the permit will only allow for the collection of fallen timber and standing trees, either dead or alive, and must not be cut or broken off in any part for firewood. Permits are not transferable or for resale, however a person may collect firewood on behalf of a permit holder.

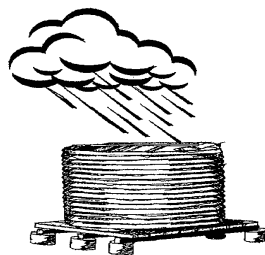

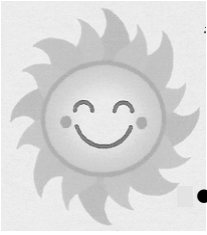

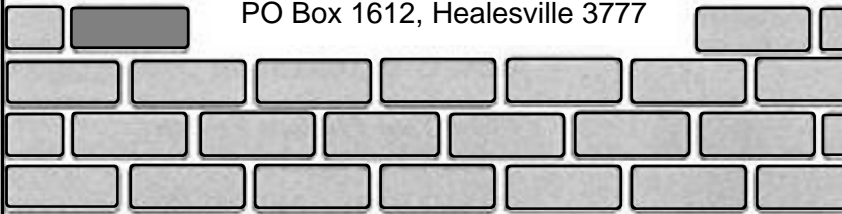
