FUNDING BOOST FOR MARYSVILLE SPORTS COMMUNITY

Marysville Cricket Club and swimming pool have received a \$200,000 boost from the Victorian and Commonwealth Governments with funding to rebuild fire-affected facilities at Gallipoli Part.

Victorian Sports Minister James Merlino and Member for Seymour Ben Hardman visited the club today to announce the grant as part of a \$500,000 boost for fire-affected clubs in the region.

The latest round of funding is part of the \$3 million *Bushfire Relief for Community Sports Clubs Recovery Fund* which was set up to rehabilitate and rejuvenate clubs after the fires.

"The State Labor Government and the Commonwealth Government are working to help Victorian communities recover from the devastating Black Saturday bushfires," Mr Merlino said.

"I'm happy to be here at the Reserve today to announce \$200,000 in funding to repair two of Marysville's sporting facilities damaged by the worst bushfires in living memory. This

funding will go a long way to restoring summer sport and recreation options in the community taken away by Black Saturday".

Mr Hardman said the funding will go towards the redevelopment of the Marysville Cricket Club's pavilion and would also go towards repair of the Marysville pool, including works to restore the filtration system and shade structures.

"Black Saturday was the worst natural disaster Australia has ever seen and we are proud to continue our massive task of rebuilding these affected communities," Mr Hardman said.

Mr Hardman said the \$500,000 package for the region included:

- \$100,000 for new courts at the Flowerdale Tennis Club
- \$100,000 for new facilities at Kinglake Pony Club; and
- \$100,000 for new clubrooms and infrastructure at Cross Country Jeep Club based at Valley Farm, Narbethong

Mr Shorten said more than \$1 million from *Bushfire Relief for Community Sports Clubs Recovery Fund* had been provided to sports clubs damaged by the bushfires.

"This funding shows our commitment to rebuilding areas of Victoria damaged by the bushfires and restoring this reserve will help the local area in the slow process of returning life to normal", Mr Shorten said.

**Murrindindi Bushfire Reconstruction
and Recovery Committee (MBRRC) – Section 86.**

The Murrindindi Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery Committee (MBRRC), has been established under section 86 of the *Local Government Act 1989* and is responsible for enabling key agencies to work together to assist communities to recover and rebuild following the 2009 bushfires.

The committee is comprised of the following six members:

- Representative of the Victorian Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery Authority (VBRRA) - Genevieve Overell (Chairperson)
- Representatives from the Murrindindi Shire Council, Councillors John Walsh, Peter Beales & Kevin Bellingham
- Representative from the Department of Human Services (DHS) - Craig Lapsley
- Representative from the Department of Planning & Community Development (DPCD) - Arden Joseph

To be as transparent as possible, MBRRC meetings are open to all members of the public; however there are times when the Committee will decide in accordance with provisions of the Local Government Act 1989 to close the meeting in order to consider agenda items that are of a confidential nature. Members of the public and press will be asked to leave the meeting for the duration of that particular item.

Issues to be brought to the attention of the MBRCC can be done so by way of letter, e-mail to msc@murrindindi.vic.gov.au or by speaking at open forum. An open forum session is held prior to each meeting to allow members of the public to address the committee in person.

To address the MBRRRC at an open forum session please complete the Open Forum Application Form which can be downloaded from Council's website at www.murrindindi.vic.gov.au or by contacting the office on 5772 0333. Request forms need to be submitted to the committee chairman prior to the commencement of the meeting.

**Council not the
relevant authority on
groundwater
management**

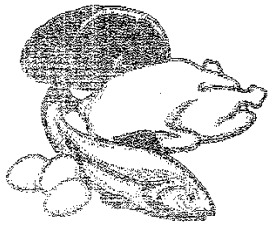
Murrindindi Council has moved to clarify it's role in the approval process for removal of groundwater from the Kinglake area.

"Council is not the relevant Authority when it comes to groundwater management and has no control on the issuing of permits and licenses to take and use groundwater", says Murrindindi Council Chief Executive Officer, Mark Henderson.

"The Authority in charge of management of groundwater is Goulburn-Murray Water and it considers applications for groundwater extraction based on available resource and likely impact on other users of the aquifer. In considering a planning application to transfer water off site Council naturally has regard to the views of the Authority responsible for the issuing of licenses to take and use groundwater under the *Water Act* said Mr Henderson.

The comments come after Council received criticism from a number of Kinglake residents concerned that the removal of ground water from the area was harming watertable levels. It is understood the complaints centre on Kinglake properties extracting groundwater and on-selling it outside the catchment. A groundwater license allows groundwater to be taken or used for irrigation, commercial or other licensed purposes depending on the type of license issued by Goulburn Murray Water.

According to the Council's Planning Department, the use of land for the extraction of groundwater does not require a planning permit from Council. Whilst planning permission is necessary for such things as the infrastructure required to transfer, store and load bulk groundwater on to trucks, Council has no control over the approval and issuing of groundwater licenses.

\$18,000 in Community Grants Announced By Murrindindi Council

Over \$18,000 in grants have been announced by the Murrindindi Shire Council as part of its Community Grants Programme.

The grant programme is designed to assist community groups and organisations with once-off or start-up projects. Community groups applying for the grants were assessed on merit taking into account the council's mission, values, objectives and strategies for the betterment of the community

Eleven community organisations will share grants totalling more than \$18,000. The grants include \$2,000 for the Upper Goulburn Community Radio to assist with the upgrade of equipment and \$4,000 to the Alexandra Timber Tramway & Museum for an event to celebrate the arrival of the rail network.

Other grants include \$5,000 for the Alexandra Truck, Ute and Rod Show, \$2,500 to the Acheron Mechanics Institute to assist with the production of a centenary history book, and \$1,287 for the installation of a new rain tank pump for the Alexandra Kindergarten.

Commenting on the grants Council's Deputy Mayor, Kevin Bellingham said Council was delighted to be able to assist so many worthwhile community projects. The grants are made three times a year and any organisations operating either in multiple locations throughout the shire or multiple groups operating in one facility were welcome to apply.

The next round of the grant process are for applications submitted between June and September to be assessed and announced in October.

Handwashing for Health

Handwashing has been high on the agenda recently with the Government and health agencies promoting frequent washing of hands as a key way to reduce the spread of swine flu.

According to the United States Centres of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), "Handwashing is the single most important means of preventing the spread of infection."

Yet, recent studies and reports indicate that lack of or poor handwashing still contributes significantly to the spread of diseases. Those groups that are especially vulnerable include pregnant women, children, old people, and those with weakened immune systems.

When to wash your hands

You should wash your hands thoroughly:

- Before preparing food
- Before eating
- Between handling raw and cooked or ready-to-eat food
- After going to the toilet or changing nappies
- After smoking
- After coughing /sneezing into you hand or using a tissue or handkerchief
- After handling rubbish or working in the garden
- After handling animals
- After attending to sick children or other family members.

Washing with soap and warm water is the best way to clean your hands.

- Wet your hands with warm water first, then add soap and lather for 15–20 seconds
- Clean all over your hands including the backs, between fingers and under your fingernails
- Rinse off all the soap and dry hands with a paper towel or clean dry towel. Germs love warm, moist hands so take your time to really dry your hands.

What about hand sanitisers and alcohol hand rubs?

Hand sanitisers and alcohol handrubs are a good interim measure when hands need a quick clean but do not replace regular handwashing.

Sanitisers should not be used:

- When hands are visibly dirty
- When there is a high risk of infection
- After going to the toilet or changing dirty nappies

If you are in a public toilet and there is no soap it is still best to wash your hands thoroughly with warm water and dry well and then apply some hand sanitiser.

Councillor Comment

On Wednesday 8 July 2009, the Kinglake West Hall was the venue for the second meeting of the Murrindindi Bushfire Recovery & Reconstruction Committee (MBRRC). The MBRRC is a delegated committee under the Murrindindi Shire Council Section 86. Members of the committee are from the Victorian Bushfire Reconstruction & Recovery Authority (VBRRA), Department of Human Services (DHS), Department of Planning and Community Development (DPCD) and Murrindindi Shire Council. These meetings are open to the public and allow time at the start of each meeting for open forum. This gives the public the opportunity to present to the committee any issues related to bushfire recovery and reconstruction.

Items for this meeting included; reports from the VBRRA and DPCD; report from the Project Control Group on the Marysville Phoenix Workshop, Kinglake Early Years Precinct development and Kinglake and Marysville Rebuilding Advisory Centres; a draft of the Terms of Reference for the Community Recovery Committees.

Community Recovery Committees (CRCs) were previously known as Community Advisory Groups (CAGs). The name change has been implemented for statewide consistency for all fire affected areas where these committees are in existence.

The purpose of the Terms of Reference is to establish a common understanding and statement of intent to work collaboratively and an

agreed governance structure for all members of the Community Recovery Committees.

The key role of the CRCs is to develop a partnership between the affected communities and agencies involved in recovery including local, state and federal governments, local non-government agencies and other organisations in order to support community recovery. In particular the CRCs will play the role as the main community advisory bodies to the Murrindindi Council and VBRRA (via the section 86 committee) on key issues affecting community recovery, and to support the council's role in municipal recovery coordination.

The CRCs will support and address a range of concerns and requirements across the community through the development and implementation of a community based recovery plan.

The CRCs acknowledges the work and deeds of existing community groups and organisations, and will work closely with these groups to coordinate local recovery initiatives. This can be a complex process.

The CRCs shall operate for a maximum two year term and after this time all remaining activities still underway will be handed on to relevant community groups and committees.

**HOARDING IS A
FIRE HAZARD**

Victoria's fire services are concerned that hoarders are unwittingly putting their lives and property at increased risk during home fires.

Community Safety Manager, John Boal said most of the hoarders were aged over 50 and generally hoarded material such as newspapers and clothing.

Hoarding is a major risk to occupants and fire services. "Piles and boxes of papers and clothing are potential sources of ignition and it also makes it very difficult for occupants to escape the fire" Mr Boal said.

"An average house fire requires about seven firefighters, whilst a fire in a hoarding household requires more than 15 firefighters" he said. The fire damage bill is also considerably higher in a hoarding household.

It is important for families to consider the increased fire risk of hoarding and to make sure there are clear paths to escape quickly in case of fire.

Mr Boal said house fires could be avoided by following this simple checklist:

Never leave cooking unattended

Turning off heating when not at home

Putting electric blankets on timers, or turning them off when you get into bed

Always using a fire guard around fires

Keep clothing and other combustible materials more than one metre away from heaters and fireplaces.

Following the presentations, a question and answer session enabled case managers to delve more deeply into specific areas of interest with a panel of council officers.

DSE and Parks Victoria working hard to protect Leadbeater's Possum

Since the February bushfires, DSE ecologists and Parks Victoria rangers have been working hard to protect a small community of Victoria's faunal emblem – the Leadbeater's Possum.

This year's bushfires burnt more than 40 percent of the possum's habitat in Victoria. The habitat includes the Mountain Ash forests around Healesville, Marysville and north of Mt Baw Baw.

Fires can have a devastating impact on the Leadbeater's Possum. It was thought that the 1939 fires had made extinct the known populations in the Central Highlands region of Victoria until it was rediscovered in 1961 near Marysville, resulting in its subsequent listing as a threatened species.

Prior to the 2009 fires, the estimated total population was less than 3000, with the species limited in distribution to a 60 x 80 km area in Victoria's Central Highlands.

The Leadbeater's Possum bushfire recovery project is taking place at Lake Mountain in Snow Gum woodland habitat where a monitoring program was established six years ago.

The intensity and severity of the 2009 fires meant that natural hollows used as den sites and 28 of the 30 previously installed nest boxes at Lake Mountain were damaged or destroyed, with little to no understorey vegetation remaining unburnt.

Prior to the fire about half of these nest boxes were occupied by colonies of Leadbeater's Possum.

The first step was to install new nest boxes to provide shelter. Infra-red monitoring cameras were set up to monitor the nocturnal possums.

The recovery team is trialling feeding stations at three locations to help the possums get through the cold winter months.

Leadbeater's Possums have never been fed in the wild before, so surveillance cameras have been installed to monitor activities.

The feeding stations are providing the possums with a carefully rationed supply of their preferred diet of mealworms, fly pupae and fruit as recommended by Healesville Sanctuary.

DSE and PV have been assisted by a number of community groups – the Friends of Leadbeater's Possum and Mount Bullfight Ski Club, and have been financially supported by the Foundation for Australia's Most Endangered Species (FAME) and the Judith Eardley Save Wildlife Association.

The Lake Mountain Alpine Resort Board, Healesville Sanctuary and the National Leadbeater's Possum Recovery Team have also been involved in the efforts to save this small marsupial from extinction.
