## THE POST AND BEAM STORY An Energy Efficient Building Method

David Baetge comes from a corporate background - is a qualified economist and professional engineer. He is also a registered Thermal Performance Assessor. He agreed to share with TN his interest in energy efficient building.



David: Years back I had a bush block nearer Melbourne. My wife at the time was doing some part-time pottery. She asked me to have a look at the mud brick house her instructor was building. This very unfinished house immediately appealed to me. I knew then that I had to have a house made of earth and subsequently designed and built our own mud brick home and then started building them as a business.

One night, years later, sitting with good friends having a few drinks, we had a great brainstorm. One of them said "I think you should do kit mud brick homes". In the morning I woke and immediately knew that I could do that. Over the years I'd written manuals for clients and other contractors detailing how best to get the finish I wanted and how to make the job easier. I knew I could supply all the materials for a home in a prepared kit

form and write a manual which explained how anyone could put it all together.

Since the idea of "kit" mud brick homes was a bit radical 25 years ago I launched the new building concept under the name Post & Beam.

In only a few years Post & Beam grew substantially and I was designing a wide range of unique homes for people all over Australia who had individual requirements for sustainable homes to fit their lifestyle.

The construction system is simple and foolproof so that owner-builders can put all the pieces together themselves like a big Mechano set. Or we can get builders to do it for them. Either way they are guaranteed of a quality end result.

Post & Beam empowers people to design and create their own individual shelter at a reasonable cost.

I am now semi-retired (what does that mean? I've never been busier or worked harder!). I used to have cutting crews but now I do it all myself from start to finish. I am very comfortable working with timber, happiest when I am covered with sawdust and wood shavings.

The more recent challenges in building - say over the last 10 years - are due to the energy requirements. Having embraced the 5 star ratings and the new bushfire requirements I am now using a material called Timbercrete which has the highest fire rating available as well as great insulation properties - pretty amazing!

Timbercrete produces masonry in a choice of many colours - lovely neutral shades are available. Or it can

be rendered to look like mud brick for a lesser cost and a greater thermal efficiency. The Timbercrete blocks are all handmade; they have slight variations which ensures that each home has its own unique character.

My job is to make it easier for people who want to build or rebuild - they do not have to worry about all the regulations, I will do that for them. I take the headache and worry out of designing and building a new home and dealing with councils, etc.

To make it as easy as possible for my clients to design their own special home I have a DIY plan kit. This FREE kit provides some basic tools and advice about how to design an energy efficient home and get their basic home ideas down on paper.

I can then very quickly provide preliminary project costs for their house design concept to that they can match this with their budget.

## Tree safety still a major concern for Council

As the cleanup after the bushfires continues throughout the shire the issue of tree safety continues to be a major concern for Council.

With more than 40% of the shire directly affected by the bushfires the massive task of identifying and minimising any dangers posed by burnt trees is an ongoing high priority.

The works are being conducted in accordance with the emergency provisions of the Murrindindi Planning Scheme, which removes the requirement for normal planning approvals in the interests of meeting Council's public safety obligations.

Responding to concerns by some residents of unnecessary tree felling, Mark Leitinger, Manager Murrindindi Construction for the Murrindindi Shire Council said the policy with respect to removal of trees has been the same throughout the emergency period.

"As part of the assessment process, all trees are being examined by qualified arborists (tree specialists) and are only marked for removal if they have been identified as either unsafe, unlikely to regenerate or if they pose a threat to houses or other buildings." "Some trees might look like they are regenerating but on closer inspection our experts often uncover an unacceptable risk" says Mark. "Detailed inspection sometimes reveals weakened limbs or deeply burned trunks not obvious to the casual observer."

"No one in council wants to remove trees unnecessarily but public safety is paramount and sometimes we are forced to err on the side of caution to protect everyone in the community."

If anyone believes a tree has been incorrectly identified for removal they can register their concern with council's engineering services. A further assessment will then be made by council's chief arborist who is responsible for overseeing all tree safety matters.

The council is not the only body involved in the removal of trees. VicRoads has responsibility for removing trees from highways and main roads whilst energy provider SP Ausnet is accountable for tree safety near overhead power lines and other related infrastructure. The Department of Sustainability and Environment and Parks Victoria share responsibility for tree safety works in parks, forests and stream frontages.

On another subject, concern has also been raised over the disposal of tree waste and mulch. Mulch is available for local residents and details are available at [murrindindi.vic.gov.au](http://murrindindi.vic.gov.au) or by calling the council offices on 5772 0333.

With respect to firewood resulting from waste logs, distribution is being coordinated by Berry Street for the eastern side of the shire including Marysville, Buxton, Narbethong etc. and Global Care for the western area, Kinglake, Flowerdale etc.

Says Mark "much of the recovered wood is still green and is not suitable for immediate use, needing time to dry. Many of the usual sources of dry firewood were destroyed in the fires but Berry Street and Global Care are endeavouring to source dry firewood for emergency relief purposes.
