## MTCRC – REPORT

It's been a very busy couple of weeks, with dozens of meetings that I have been attending, the UDF plans on Display and the Premier promising that the Primary School will open Term.2, 2010 in Marysville. The CRC has been working away on Template Projects, seeking more information on them, looking at budgets, working with other groups and committees including MATDG to try and match any donated funds to projects. The more projects that can be funded by outside donations, the more projects we can push up into our top 25 and ask VBRRRA to fund. We have also approved 3 winter events for funding in Taggerty, Narbethong and Marysville. The Murrindindi Shire was good enough to pick up the tab for 3 of the projects in our top 25, worth more than \$300,000. It's worth mentioning 2 more projects from the Community Plan, the first being the After School Arts Program. At the moment the local arts group are giving up their time to run this program and it would be great to see it continue. The second being, the Wilkes Creek Horse Yards, which are part of the National Trail. These yards are used by different groups, not only the horse riders, but also 4 wheel drive clubs and camping for school groups. As the MTCRC evolves as a Community Committee, it looks to involve people from different parts of the Triangle. Therefore, the MTCRC will be taking on a representative from the MOCA Committee. As we start to look at the economics of the area, we understand that this part of the Community will play a part in the recovery. One of our MTCRC representatives, Rita Seethaler, tabled a paper titled "Sustainability Expo's in Murrindindi 2010/11". The Murrindindi Climate Network, in conjunction with other partners, would like to deliver the Expo at Easter 2010 in Marysville. The paper outlined the potential program and exhibitors. The Committee agreed that a possible location for the Expo could be the Rebuilding Advisory Centre – which would be complementary for both purposes. Rita advised that once the money has been committed to the Expo project a working committee will be formed to manage the Expo planning. The Committee agreed that it would be a great project for the Triangle, it was also suggested that the Shire's community bus could be used if there were multiple locations.

The rebuilding Advisory Centre has finally started and it will be great to see it finished, so that the new council offices can be placed there to help move planning permits through a lot quicker. It's a positive sight to see when building plans start to roll into the Shire; this has to be encouraging to us all as we move through the recovery process.

## Councillor Comment

Over this past week I have had the opportunity to attend various ceremonies where the Victorian State Government has distributed grant funding throughout our local communities.

At Eildon, two projects supported by the Victorian Government's Boating Safety and Facilities Program were officially announced:

- The Eildon Alliance Boat Ramp Committee received \$102,546 of grant funding to extend the boat ramp, which is now approximately 50 metres long to provide greater access for boat owners to launch at the weir.
- Eildon Urban Fire Brigade purchased a new search and rescue boat with fire fighting equipment. Made possible with funding of \$315,000.

Both Eildon Alliance and the Fire Brigade contributed an amount towards the cost of both of these projects. I congratulate both committees for the dedication given to these projects over the last three years.

On Tuesday 22 September in Marysville, the Acting Premier and the Minister for Youth, Sport and Recreation together with Cricket Victoria provided cricket equipment to the under 13 cricketers as an encouragement to form a local junior cricket teams.

Following this presentation at the Marysville Bowling Club, it was announced that the Marysville Lawn

Bowling Club was the recipient of \$200,000 towards the installation of a synthetic bowling green. This will allow drought free bowling for a very appreciative group of bowlers.

At the Buxton Trout Farm later that afternoon, we witnessed the release of approximately 5,000 fingerlings by the Fisheries Department to support the breeding program of our local trout farm which has been extremely affected by the fires in February.

There are many opportunities for organisations to apply for grant funding towards projects. Many funding offers are advertised in local media or further information may be obtained online.

### **Bushfire Affected Residents Set To Reap New Solar Hot Water Rebate**

## MAYORS CHAIR

As with every passing week we have new activity happening across the shire.

We welcomed a number of funding and project announcements across the shire with Acting Premier Rob Hulls visiting Marysville with Minister James Merlino and State MP Ben Hardman, to announce \$200,000 funding for a synthetic green for the Marysville Bowls Club and equipment from Cricket Victoria for our young people to play cricket at the temporary village site. Buxton Trout Farm received 5,000 fingerlings. It was a pity we didn't notice the large bird who decided it was dinner time, so some of fingerlings got snapped up fairly quickly. Ben Hardman caught a good size fish so he took dinner home. We pass on our sincere thanks for the funding which is part of the continued funding we are receiving from both levels of government.

We all know how important it is to continue working together to help our communities rebuild their lives, homes and communities after the devastating fires. We must continue to also help support the communities across the whole of the shire who have given so much, showing strength and courage beyond the norm.

Cr Beales and I recently had lunch with the Mayor and Councillor from Boroondara City Council who have provided a good deal of support both morally and administratively since the fires. After lunch we showed them around some of the bushfire affected areas.

On Thursday Minister Tim Palace announced a permanent pedestrian crossing in Kinglake and this will give the shire its first set of traffic lights. We weren't sure whether this was good or bad, but on the whole we must ensure safe pedestrian access for the town.

A bushfire community workshop was held in Kinglake West recently to talk about a range of subjects including:

- what is working well?
- what can be done better?
- identifying five priorities if they ever found themselves in similar circumstances, heaven forbid
- what do you believe would help you feel safe this coming fire season?

The outcomes of the discussions are currently being collated and will be distributed as well as fed into the council and state and federal governments. It is really important that we provide future communities with our knowledge, learnings and experience.

Last week council adopted the draft Council Plan, Strategic Resource Plan and Budget documents. These documents have been distributed for community inspection and comment with copies being available at all council offices, Eildon Resource Centre and Flowerdale and Marysville Community Services Hubs. Written submissions must be received before 5pm on Tuesday 27 October 2009 and addressed to the Chief Executive Officer, Murrindindi Shire Council, PO Box 138, Alexandra, 3714. Council will meet to consider any submissions and the adoption of the Council Plan and Budget at a meeting of Council scheduled for Wednesday 28 October 2009.

## Your Health and Well-Being

From Community Health

### Medical Specialist Services Available Locally

Murrindindi Shire residents now have a range of medical specialist services right here in the shire, making trips to Melbourne to see specialists less necessary.

Several specialists visit Alexandra District Hospital and/or Yea and District Memorial Hospital on a regular basis. A referral from your GP is required to consult a specialist and appointments are necessary.

At Alexandra Hospital, outpatient consultations can be made with a General Surgeon, Gynaecologist, Ear, Nose and Throat Surgeon, Orthopaedic Surgeon, Gastroenterologist, Urologist, Ophthalmologist (eye specialist), Cardiologist, Paediatrician, Audiologist, Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist. Some of these services are also available at Yea Hospital. Check with your doctor.

A Specialist Anaesthetist supports the surgical specialists at Alexandra Hospital, making some surgical procedures possible locally. Ear, Nose and Throat surgery includes tonsillectomy, adenoidectomy, insertion of ear tubes, and sinus surgery. Endoscopy surgery includes gastroscopy and colonoscopy. Eye surgery includes removal of cataracts and eyelid surgery. General surgery includes hernia repairs, carpal tunnel surgery and removal of skin lesions. Gynaecology surgery includes hysterectomy (abdominal and vaginal), vaginal repairs, laparoscopy, hysteroscopy, colposcopy and tubal ligation. Orthopaedic surgery includes arthroscopy. Urology surgery includes cystoscopy and minor prostate surgery.

Xray, Ultrasound, Podiatry and Pathology services are available at both Yea and Alexandra.

And a reminder that a comprehensive range of Community Health services are also available from the hospitals and from Mitchell Community Health. You can make an appointment, without a doctor's referral, to see a dietitian, occupational therapist, psychologist, social worker, diabetes nurse, asthma nurse, women's health nurse, and more. **Amnesty period on open air burning in residential areas within Murrindindi Shire**

The summer fire season is upon us and property owners should remain diligent and continue to prepare their defences against the threat of fire, especially given the devastation caused by the 7 February 2009 Bushfires. The history of bushfires in Victoria provides valuable lessons and assists us in developing means to combat and prevent fires. Every landowner has a responsibility to themselves to ensure they take the necessary steps to prevent fires and reduce the risk of injury or damage to persons or property.

This year working in conjunction with the CFA and Municipal Fire Prevention Committee; Council will allow an **'AMNESTY PERIOD'** for burning off, to coincide with the upcoming CFA - Fire Action Week.

Therefore, during this amnesty period, residents/landowners will be allowed to 'burn off' any vegetation material without requiring a permit from **3 October to 18 October 2009** (inclusive), without fear of breaching Council's Local Laws.

Although this amnesty period exempts persons from breaching Council's Local Laws, it does not exempt persons who light fires that cause a nuisance, created by the smoke from these fires. Please ensure that when burning off, that your fire does not create a nuisance.

**NO WINDROWS MUST BE LIT. ALL FIRES MUST BE NO LARGER THAN A METRE IN DIAMETER OR A METRE IN HEIGHT.**

The local fire brigades in your immediate area have been made aware of this 'amnesty period'.

**\*\*Please Note\*\*** For persons not wishing to burn off, Council is offering residents **free disposal** of their household vegetation material at all Waste Transfer Station sites on the above dates. Please ensure you present your Tip ID Tag or Rates Notice to the Transfer Station Attendant on arrival.

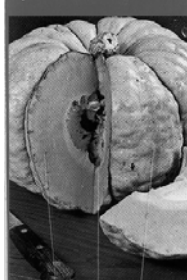
