NAB Help with Bushfire Recovery Efforts

On Wednesday 18th November one hundred and forty top performing National Australia Bank executives arrived at Lake Mountain to help with the bushfire recovery efforts. On a thirty degree day they would have been forgiven for taking it easy, however this was certainly not the case. These bankers were motivated and ready to go.

The day involved work on two different projects, a board walk at Snowy Hill and mountain bike trail construction. The one hundred and forty star achievers were split into groups of ten and assigned a Lake Mountain staff member to work with for the day.

Whilst using drills, chisels and carpentry tools was a foreign concept for most of the group, the resorts expectations were exceeded in what turned out to be a very productive day.

This was followed by dinner in Lake Mountain's main building. The meal was provided by Yarra Valley Catering, using local produce and entertainment was supplied by well known artist Mark Seymour and his band in what was a fitting end to a brilliant day.
