FLAP!

Melbourne's latest sensation have burst their way onto the live music scene impressing the audiences, the festival directors and the critics alike.

A quick scan of the internet reveals an array of impressive reviews seemingly from a variety of age groups. Most folk prefer to bypass the difficult if not impossible task of categorizing Flap's style of music preferring instead to say what they think about it.

The most seasoned of musical ears are hailing the young group's MUSIC as intoxicating, cheeky, invigorating, classy, innovative, unique, exuberant and the list of gushing complimentary adjectives goes on.

The five piece group is led by honey sweet vocalist and ukulele player Jessica Guille who also writes a lot of their songs.

Multi talented Eamon McNelis writes the other half of the songs as well as sings and plays trumpet (not at the same time, that would just be too multi talented!). His songs are as full of the drama, joy and humour of Melbourne's inner north.

When you add Shannon Barnett on trombone, Mark Elton on double bass and Ben Hendry on drums you might begin to get a glimpse of why they are hard to pigeon hole.

Most, but not all, of their material is original as is played in kind of a 1920's jazz style.

They sing about falling off cliffs, getting naked and being poor, as well as some universal themes like falling in love & getting drunk. Flap!'s sound is held together by their dancey, driving rhythm section & topped off by stunning solos. The band has loads of energy and charm and their stage presence is unmistakably, unpretentious Australian.

Flap! Will be appearing live THIS Friday 8pm at the Marysville Golf Club. Flap! is the first event in the 2010 Café Culture Series, a series of four shows scheduled for this year.

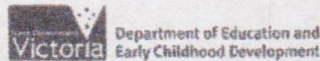

**LEADERSHIP PROGRAM TO TACKLE
DROUGHT STRESS**

A LEADERSHIP program will be offered to everyone in the Shires of Murrindindi, Mitchell, Strathbogie and Mansfield with the aid of \$72,500 in State Government funding.

The Member for Seymour, Ben Hardman, said the \$146,000 program, *Adjustment and Adaptation – Developing Leadership Through Change*, would be auspiced by Murrindindi Shire on behalf of the Murrindindi Drought Strategy Committee.

"The Murrindindi Drought Strategy Committee identified that 13 years of drought, with its associated economic and environmental stress, has left many residents tired, anxious and failing to make timely, strategic and proactive decisions about business and family," Mr Hardman said.

"Bushfires in 2006, 2007 and then 2009 have compounded the stress and resulted in people disengaging from their normal volunteer and community activities. Many of the region's natural leaders are faltering under the weight of expectations placed on them.

"This program seeks to increase leadership skills and capacity with learning opportunities that are widely accessible to the broader community, to help them understand and adapt positively to the changing conditions around them. It will give people the confidence and skills to contribute to their community, provide opportunities to gather together and develop or re-establish networks and help the local economy by enabling people to access training locally rather than having to travel elsewhere."

To reach the broadest possible audience, the program will be delivered in a wide range of formats and venues, including formal training, expos, seminars, workshops, interactive activities, small-group sessions and large community events with high-profile speakers.

It will cover three broad themes of Community Sustainable Living; Community Strengthening and Social Well Being; and Community Cultural Engagement.

"The Leadership Through Change program will complement the Local Leaders Community Resilience and Preparedness Project in Murrindindi in 2006 after two seasons of bushfires in the Shire, a project that was also supported by the State Government," Mr Hardman said.

"Those who trained as part of that project have been instrumental in the 2009 fire recovery efforts.

"I am sure the 2009 Leadership Through Change program will also achieve positive outcomes for leadership in the region."

A Future Buxton.

Buxton is growing and changing – witness Dyes Lane 45 block subdivision (Ref. The Phoenix paper).

Marysville is renewing itself with new expanded civic buildings in which the town will take great pride. It is time for us, the people of Buxton to change- to lift our expectations away from “relocated, recycled and re-vamped” to “new, architecturally designed and permanent” civic amenities. Our rates are now similar to the best of suburban Melbourne and we can expect our village and surrounds to be of better quality.

Two buildings in my thoughts at present are the Community Hall and the temporary kindergarten.

The hall is about to have a quarter of a million dollar or more upgrade which will result in internal amenity improvements and a small external deck on the side of the building – as I understand it. I don't think the ambience of the building inside nor the general appearance will be much changed. This building is a natural depressant for me and for others. We need to put aside pouring funding into this old fibro and masonite structure and push the council for a real civic hall to lift the standard of our village and point to the direction of a future Buxton.

The temporary kindergarten has given parents a taste of the convenience of having a local kinder, so understandably there is a mood in the community for having a permanent kinder in Buxton. Again we should discard any thought of making do with a re-cycled temporary building and push/demand a better and permanent building on its own block of land. The reserve must not be whittled away, as open land once lost is never regained. The park is too valuable – especially to an expanding Buxton, to let it shrink. Many people see the current kinder as an eyesore in the park, wrongly situated, temporary and cheap in appearance and (if made permanent) reflecting our submissive attitude of accepting the cheapest solution to our requirements rather than the best solution.

Also I want to put in a plea for the growing children of this area and call for the putting aside of an area for a sports oval (not the reserve which is valuable for passive recreation and motorized visitors). A real oval would allow our children to develop the skills we love our sports people to have- kicking a footy and soccer ball, hitting a cricket ball, playing hockey, hitting a softball, learning to run, jump and throw, and being coached in these things. The reserve is unsuitable for any of this as the space is insufficient and the surface too rough for safety. An Australian town or village is incomplete without a sports ground.

Finally, town planning for Buxton may have been undertaken sometime, but I seemed to have missed it. Dyes Lane offered a great opportunity for clever planning – offering a lifestyle to a community which could enjoy safe pathways, scenic and small quiet areas, a playground, efficient housing, recycled water, a fenceless development with a mixture of housing styles both single and double story appropriate to young families and older people- and so on. By the look of it from the roadway (I have not seen any plans, so may be wrong) the development is substantially just a regular subdivision – a lost opportunity?
