Funds put push into students riding campaign

When it comes to the Great Victorian Bike Ride the Yea township has extended its participation by not only gearing up in striving to take the honour as the ride's most welcoming town, but 22 of its finest students will also take part in the event thanks to the Community Recovery Fund.

Murrindindi Shire Council Mayor Peter Beales said the fund provided a wonderful opportunity for the students to participate and enjoy the camaraderie associated with the ride.

"This is a great opportunity for Council to thank the Yea, Eildon and Marysville communities for their commitment towards this major event that will have some great long-term benefits in promoting our shire as a great place to visit."

More than 5000 riders and 500 support staff will visit Eildon, Yea and Marysville as part of this year's ride, hitting the shire on Friday (Dec 3).

"There is a real sense of support for this event, with each of our towns striving to give competitors a great experience."

The Community Recovery Fund allocation has subsidised entry fees, provided transport options to the starting and finishing points and helped with the cost of cycling attire.

"The students' uniforms will be a great endorsement for Yea and our shire. I wish them well."

Students, teachers and support staff are taking part. The Community Recovery Fund is supported by the Australian Government and the Department of Planning and Community Development and administered by Murrindindi Shire Council. It supports projects assisting youth activities, restoring community space, improving communications and recording history associated with the 2009 bushfires.

To date more than \$100,000 has been allocated across the shire.

Rain event takes toll on UT Creek crossing

Heavy rainfall across Murrindindi Shire over the weekend has resulted in limited damage, however one casualty has been the old timber pedestrian bridge near the Alexandra Bowling Club.

Council's Executive Manager Engineering & Emergency Management Ian Ellett said heavy rainfall into the UT Creek Catchment had resulted in heavy flows carrying a significant amount of debris.

"The bridge, which had a central pier, appears to have been hit by a large log during the early hours of Sunday morning," Mr Ellett said.

"The central pier had been previously affected by storm flow in January 2010, moving slightly because of similar conditions. That resulted in the bridge deck being slightly out of line and out of level.

"While slightly out of shape, the pier was secure and the bridge was safe.

"Council has been working with both VicRoads and the Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority in determining the extent of works in repairing the bridge. However, the weekend's rain event has resulted in Council staff making inquiries to have works commence sooner rather than later on a full bridge replacement.

"We are committed to resolving the situation as soon as possible with the hope of asking for quotes in December with construction to start early in the New Year."

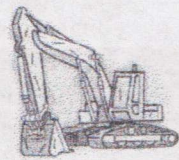

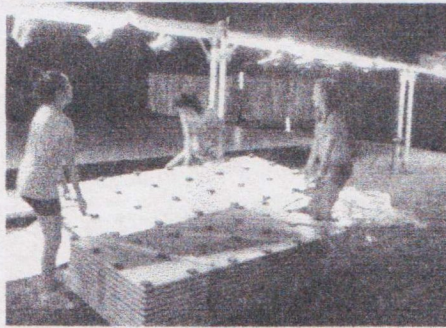
More on the Ballet...
