## New business brings many benefits to Marysville

Rebuilding Marysville will take a major step with the opening of a new pharmacy, the first time the township has had such a service.

Pharmacist Andrew Clayton has established the new business that will open on December 18.

"Following the February 2009 fires I heard about the Kinglake Pharmacy getting a lot of help from the industry to get back on its feet. I assumed, probably like many other people, that Marysville had a pharmacy too and wondered what happened to it in the fires. It was only after searching for these details that I realised there never had been one," Mr Clayton said.

"I'm very excited about opening Marysville's first pharmacy and am very much looking forward to providing a caring and professional service for Marysville and surrounding communities. I'll be working as closely as possible with other local health providers to provide the best quality care I can."

Cathedral Ward Councillor Kevin Bellingham said the community appreciated Mr Clayton's commitment to supporting Marysville.

"Andrew's investment in Marysville will have many benefits, not only are we getting the services of a pharmacist who has more than two decades of experience, his decision to open a business here could be the catalyst for other small business operators to consider future investment here," Cr Bellingham said.

"It will be a very good business for Marysville. Murrindindi Shire Council and the Victorian Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery Authority (VBRRA) have been working closely with Andrew for many months in helping him establish the pharmacy."

The pharmacy will be temporarily located in shop F of Marysville Central. It will operate Monday to Friday and from 9am to noon on Saturdays.

The pharmacy was successful in the Victorian Bushfire Business Investment Fund, which will support its move into a permanent location next year.

The official opening will take place on Saturday December 18 and all the community has been invited to the event where there will be free refreshments, giveaways and opening specials.
