New Era at Lake Mountain

The Chairperson of the Lake Mountain Alpine Resort Management Board, Ralph Booth is delighted to announce the appointment of a new CEO for the Mountain Resort. Mr Paul Squires has been appointed to the role following an extensive recruitment process.

Mr Booth said "The Board were seeking an individual who had a skill mix that reflected the future needs of the mountain. And was committed to living locally. Lake Mountain is undergoing considerable redevelopment and the draft strategic plan and master-plan required a CEO that would continue to drive these initiatives."

Mr Booth said "Paul has over 20 years experience as an executive in the public and private sector. This experience has primarily been in Local Government. Recently he has managed large recreation and cultural centres in the United Kingdom. These facilities attracted over a million visitors per annum. He was also the Senior Project Manager for the Greater London Authority, managing the redevelopment of Trafalgar Square in London. In Australia his most recent role was as General Manager Community Services with the Rural City of Wangaratta. The Board were impressed by both the passion Paul has displayed for the role already and the value that his experience will add to our extensive plans for the development and operation of the mountain."

Mr Squires said: "It is a privilege to be appointed to this exciting role. Lake Mountain has been led by retiring CEO Richard Rogerson for many years and he and his team have worked tirelessly to raise Lake Mountain from the ashes of Black Saturday and contribute to the economic recovery of Marysville and the region. As a result the Mountain has not only new facilities under construction but also a sound plan for a sustainable future. I am looking forward to bringing the same sort of passion, commitment and vision that the present team have displayed. My goal will be to continue to take Lake Mountain forward as a year round resort that contributes to the local economy, environment and community"

Mr Squires will take up his appointment in early January 2011.

The old saying that "Nice Guys come Last" was proved wrong recently when Geoff Ogilvy won the Australian Golf Open in Sydney by 4 strokes.

Geoff is a good friend of the Marysville Community Golf & Bowls Club, and recently made a special donation to the club, in conjunction with the Ilhan Food Allergy Foundation. The prize was for two people to attend the Australian Golf Open and, more importantly, to be able to walk "inside the ropes" on day 1 as part of Geoff Ogilvy's group - definitely the best seat in the house.

The Club auctioned the tickets and the winner, Doug Dawson from Seaford, duly walked with the Ogilvy group on Day 1. Geoff definitely did not disappoint, firing a 4 under par 68 on the first day to be right up with the leaders. He then went on to better that on days 2 and 3, with a 65 and 67 to hold a 5 stroke lead at the end of three rounds. He then withstood a strong challenge from Matt Jones on the final day to take the title by 4 strokes with a 19-under par score of 269

Geoff's generous donation has helped the Marysville Community Golf & Bowls Club in it's fundraising efforts after the Black Saturday bushfires, as they seek to redevelop the Club as a sustainable community and sporting resource for the Marysville district. Club President Doug Walter expressed the views of the Marysville community when he said "It is only with support from nice guys like Geoff that we will be able to get back on our feet."
