Another Win for the Marysville Bowlers and A First Win For The Marysville Golfers.

As reported last week the Marysville bowlers recently won the Metropolitan Division 7 Section 5 Pennant with a convincing win over Ringwood at Chirnside Park. Last Saturday in Healesville they played Warburton in the Grand Final of Division 7 and beat them by 20 shots. Each player was presented with a Bowls Victoria Metropolitan Pennant Division 7 Champion Medal. Congratulations to all the Marysville bowlers who now go into training for the next pennant season beginning in October!

The Marysville golf club car park was full to capacity on Saturday when fifty golfers from Lakeside golf club in Albert Park joined fifty Marysville golfers for the inaugural Lakeside Marysville Challenge. The Lakeside golfers have to vacate their course during the week of the Australian Grand Prix and their members chose to play at Marysville as a way of escaping the city. The Marysville contingent included former members, new members, friends of members and current members. The hundred golfers hit off in groups of four comprising two golfers from each club and played a stableford round. The best three scores from each club were added together and Marysville were declared the winners by a short margin. The three Marysville players whose scores were totalled were Robbie Coleman (20) with 38 points, Gail Leigh (13) with 38 points and Wayne Bissett (22) with 39 points. Murchison Street trees get a taste of new technology

Marysville's historic Murchison Street trees have undergone an innovative technique to construct infiltration pits so that there is improved water infiltration and aeration around their root systems.

Under the guide of Council's independent arborist Chris Spencer (ENSPEC), a specialist excavation company has been strategically hydro-vacuuming pits within specifically chosen tree root systems to improve infiltration and allow for improved aeration (gaseous exchange).

Cathedral Ward Councillor Kevin Bellingham said Council and the Victorian Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery Authority (VBRRRA) were pleased with the continued improvement of the town's main street trees.

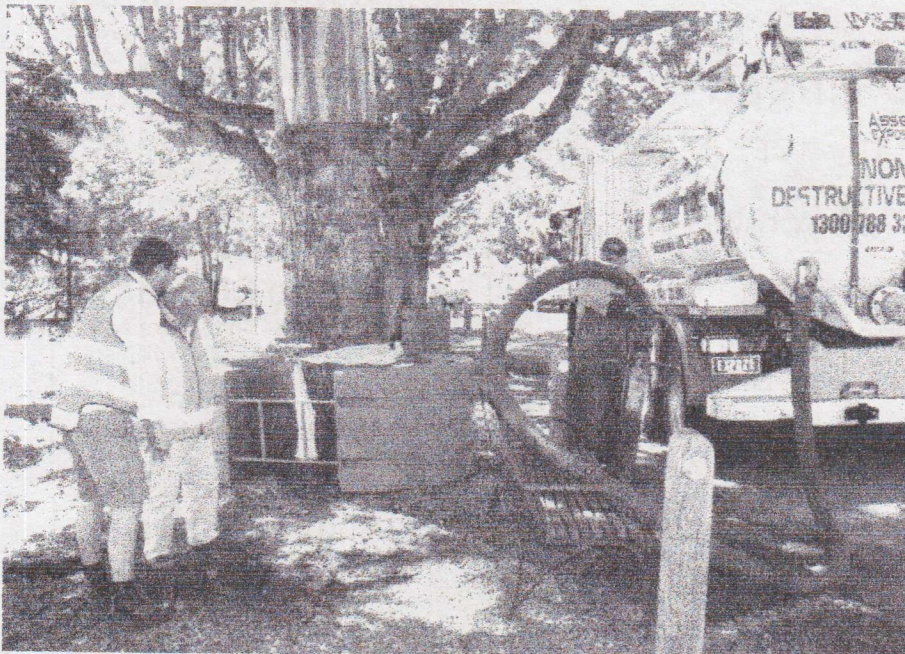
"It has been an extensive and intensive program to improve the condition of the Murchison Street trees. We have been fortunate with the weather conditions, and our considerable works program, has meant the trees continue to improve."

Mr Spencer said the latest works used a hydro-vacuum to create 500mm to 1000 mm deep holes (150mm wide) around several of the more vulnerable existing mature trees. The technology provides a non-destructive excavation tool that avoids significant damage to roots greater than 20 mm in diameter.

"The holes were back filled with a mixture of 30mm - 50mm river stone, the aim of which is to improve infiltration and aeration for these trees," he said.

The \$1.35 million Murchison Street and Town Amenity project has been funded by the Victorian Bushfire Appeal Fund on behalf of donors from across Australia and the world and aims to restore the character and heritage significance of key streets in the town, with extensive landscaping work, complemented by civic works including public art, street furniture and the creation of pedestrian friendly links.

Council is working closely with VBRRRA and its managing contractor Bovis Lend Lease in co-ordinating the works.

Marysville Construction Update

Gallipoli Park

Last week the Project Control Group undertook a site inspection of the Playspace and Reflective Garden construction site where the group saw a big change to the outlook as the site sheds have been removed, the pathways and garden beds have been formed and the stone walls are finished.

The specialty playground pieces are well on their way, with the climbing tower and blue tongue lizard taking pride of place, as well as the interactive water toy, flying fox, balancing pads and slides also making good progress.

The next items include the gazebo, planting of the garden beds with trees and small understory tubestock. The mature rhododendrons have been secured from the Toolangi wholesale nursery and will be transplanted at a later date during their dormant season to reduce the risk of shock from the move.

Construction will be extended to ensure that works are completed on time and meets the grand opening date that is being planned on 9 April.

Community Centre – Stage Two

Another key milestone has been achieved with the structural steel team installing the steel work to the community centre facilities as well as half of the sports hall.

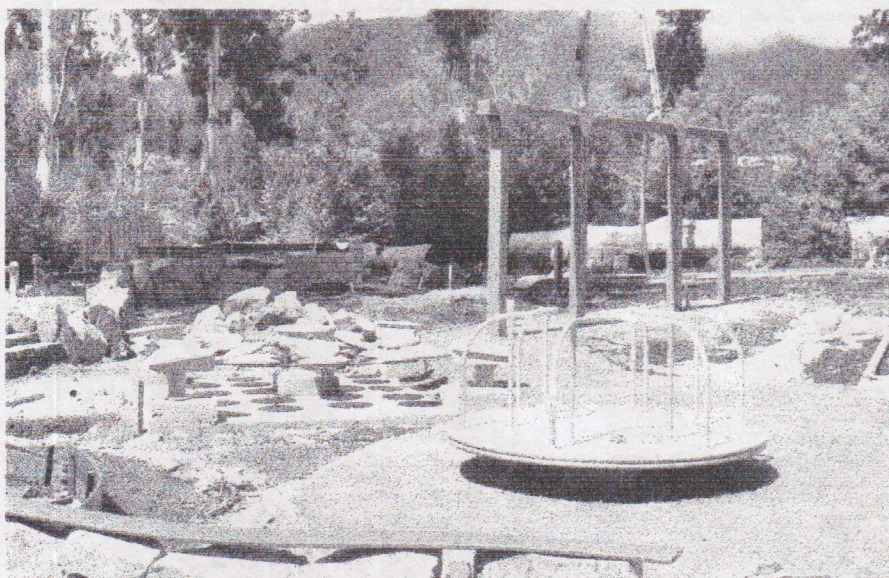
The concrete slab pours will continue through this month with the completion of the sports hall as well as the suspended areas.

The second floor is constructed as a composite concrete and steel slab, which consists of sheet metal material being supported by the steel beams and reinforced concrete slab being poured on top.

The next steps include the installation of the sheet metal roofing and wall cladding to the structural steel. The wall cladding is a mixture of materials with the sports hall facing Falls Road being clad with a timber hardwood.

Bovis Lend Lease will be arranging small groups to tour the site next month, and we will provide you with more information about how to register shortly.

Footy Progress at Marysville

This weekend will see the start of Football action at Marysville with the town hosting practice games on both Saturday 19th and Sunday 20th March.

Saturday should produce a high standard of Football with long established clubs Greensborough (Diamond Valley Football League) in a full hit out against Norwood from the powerful Eastern Football League.

Activities will commence at 9.40 AM with the Colts (U17) match followed by Reserves at 12.00 noon and the main game at 2.15. Further details can be seen on the EFL website www.effl.org.au

On Sunday the Trevor Harrow Oval at Gallipoli Park will host a full day of Junior Football with Park Orchards North Ringwood Junior Parish Football Club staging eight intra club practice games, commencing at 8.30 AM with the Tackers (Under 9's) through to the Colts (Under 17's). The strength of this club is such that it has the luxury of 350 players to choose from, a positive indication of the strength of AFL Football in Melbourne. It is expected that this event will produce numbers well in excess of 1000 people to the town through the day.

This event is normally held at Kinglake and run by the Kinglake Football Club, but this year their ground was unavailable, and Kinglake were very keen to offer the event to Marysville as a further show of support to the town. Last year Kinglake and Mt Evelyn came to Marysville and staged a replay of the 2009 Grand Final and through these activities, there is a great bond developing between the two towns, both recovering from the Black Saturday fires.

There will be a similar event on the following Sunday 27th March when the Healesville Junior Football Club will visit Marysville for a series of practice matches.

These activities have been co-ordinated by the Marysville District Football & Netball Club as part of an ongoing commitment to re-introduce Football and Netball to the region.

Further matches will be held in April as a lead up to the big day on Sunday 1st May when a Marysville based team will take the field in the opening round of the Yarra Valley Mountain District Veterans competition against Mt Evelyn. This will be the first time since 1983 that a Marysville based team has featured in an official capacity.
