Weekend Footy action at Gallipoli Park

Last weekend saw a full 2 days of Football at the Trevor Harrow Oval. On Saturday we had a visit from two well established clubs in Greensborough, from the Diamond Valley Football League and Norwood, a first division club from the powerful Eastern Football League. These clubs played 3 full scale practice games with U17's, Reserves and Seniors and they treated the healthy crowd to a top class display of Football.

On Sunday, the Park Orchards North Ringwood Parish junior Football Club staged their grading practice matches. This is an extremely strong club which boasts a list of about 380 Junior players from Tackers (Under 9's) to Colts (Under 17's). This was another very successful family day of Football which produced a crowd in excess of 1000 people.

These events were hosted by the Marysville District Football & Netball Club as part of its ongoing campaign to attract sporting events to the District and rekindle an interest in Foot-

ball in preparation for the debut of the Marysville District Veterans Football team which plays its first official game at Gallipoli Park on Sunday May 1st. This will be the first Marysville side to play in competition football for 28 years and is a date to mark in your diary as a special event for the community.

Sunday March 20th a full day of intra club pre-season games with Park Orchards North Ringwood Parish Junior Football Club. A total of 8 games starting at 8.30 am and ending with the Colts at 6pm.

The Sunday game produced a special guest in Nth Melbourne 'Shinboner of the Century' Glen Archer who signed up as a member of Marysville District and was invited to play in the opening game. No commitment yet but the club is keeping fingers crossed!

Sunday March 27 will feature pre-season games with the Healesville Football Club. A great family day.
