Sell-off of saleyards will bring new opportunities for Alexandra

Dismantling of Alexandra's saleyards will commence shortly with the site earmarked for future industrial expansion.

Temporary fencing will be placed around the site on Monday, 11 July with dismantling works to start on Monday 18 July. From July 11 there will be no public access into the facility.

Mayor Peter Beales said Council, working closely with the Alexandra Saleyards Committee, had supported the deconstruction of the superstructure, with the aim of using the land to support future industrial development.

"This work will be undertaken by Kaefer Integrated Services and is expected to take up to two weeks," Cr Beales said.

"A public auction of materials will be held on Sunday 14 August to capture the best competition for lots."

The auction will be conducted by Landmark Embling.

There has not been a sale held at the yards since January 2008 because of occupational health and safety and animal welfare issues.

"It is important that the options available to utilise the site are based on attracting new industrial investment into the region. There will be a number of factors that need to be taken into consideration as we progress this project, including relevant soil testing, subdivision options and development options, but we are committed to the site

being available to support the existing Peterkin Place industrial estate and the planned Binns-McCrae Road industrial estate," Cr Beales said.

Council believes a number of industrial blocks could be created in Alexandra under the proposal.

"Council is also supporting significant investment into the Yea Saleyards that will establish that facility as one of the best in regional Victoria," Cr Beales said.

"With the construction of a roof to create an all weather site, the Yea Saleyards will have the ability to attract more sales to our region and continue to support our local cattlemen with a first rate facility."

GVW Improvement Works to Commence in Marysville

Goulburn Valley Water (GVW) will be undertaking works along the unmade road reserve of Mt Kitchener Avenue over coming weeks.

GVW District manager Ken Turner said 1 km of pipeline is to be installed along the walking track which is currently closed to the public.

"It is not expected that customers will be affected during the works, as they are taking place primarily in an area that is off-limits following the fires," Mr Turner said

"The principal works involve the installation of a 140mm diameter electrical conduit," Mr Turner said.

"This will enable the provision of a power supply at the reservoir to service future works, such as remote monitoring equipment."

The installation will commence at the area adjacent to Aub Cuzens Reservoir, and extend to 70m beyond the intersection of Mt Kitchener Road and Kings Road.

The \$120,000 project, to be undertaken by Energyworks Australia Pty. Ltd, will begin mid July and is expected to take 6-8 weeks.

Works should be completed by September, weather permitting.

Marysville and Triangle residents have taken the chance to see first-hand the steady progress of the construction of Marysville Community Centre Stage Two.

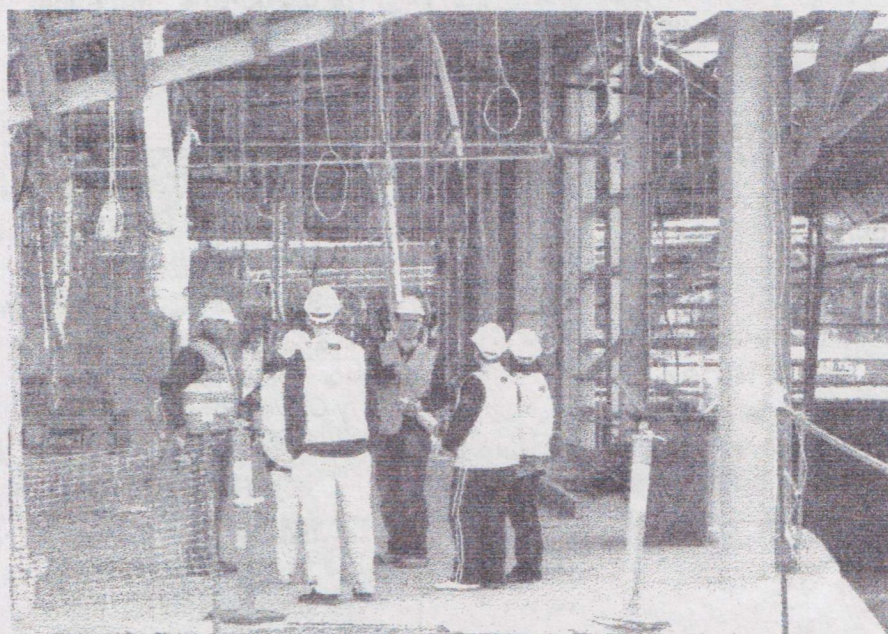
A planned tour of the building recently attracted more than 30 people to inspect the work in progress.
