Retirement for one of Council's longest serving employees

When Murrindindi Shire Council's rates officer Judy Young started at the organisation Harold Holt was Prime Minister, The Seekers were at the height of their international fame, Australia's population was nudging 12 million people and Victoria won the Sheffield Shield.

That was 1967, and on Friday 15 July, after 44 years serving the Murrindindi community, Judy had her final day as a Murrindindi Shire Council employee.

"I started on 3 January 1967, there were only eight employees - how things have changed," Judy said.

"I have seen many changes over the years - from manually working out the rate and writing it in a rate book, then typing each rate notice, to the current computer calculations and extracting them for the printers."

Judy paid tribute to her colleagues working in the now finance department saying it had been a pleasure to come to work every day.

"The Council certainly has its challenges, but I have seen a dedicated Murrindindi staff trying to always do their best for the community," she said.

Mayor Peter Beales said Judy's dedication and professionalism was outstanding. "She will be missed. Judy has been a pillar of support for her colleagues and she has been a great servant for the people of our shire," Cr Beales said. "Nothing has been too much trouble."

Judy plans to remain busy during her retirement with a spot of travel and lots of family time high on her agenda.
